

Pastor's Annual Report 2010

2010 marks the completion of my seventh year as Pastor of Second Presbyterian Church. This year felt like a fast moving stream in which fresh water flowed into the stretch of river that is this congregation. The result was a steady flow of flourishing fellowship and ministry that God is using to make a difference in this community, and in communities outside our walls. July, August, and September was for me a time of clergy-renewai leave, which allowed me a view of the river from the bank. Thank you for the time to reflect, rest, and recharge for more time together in this blessed community of faith. Here are some observations from the bank:

- Our congregational leadership: staff, officers, and all members, is increasing the ways in which it contributes to Second's ministry and mission. Greater synergy continues to develop between Karmen Vandyke, Beverly Chavez, and Dora Martinez who work so well together on behalf of this congregation. Members of the Session are taking on more leadership every year and doing so with enthusiasm and heart. The Deacons rallied when their leader Martha Duran became a member of the church triumphant, and members are finding more ways to be involved beyond Sunday mornings. The leadership in this church is strong and by the grace of God, getting stronger.
- Our building is being used more from folks outside the congregation. Wing's
 For Life, a ministry for families of incarcerated individuals and the Martineztown Mobile Food Pantry each used our space twice a month to offer ministry
 and food to those in need. Through our missional commitments, these are
 just two ways we helping the community simply by opening our doors.
- Speaking of the building, it is about to experience significant renovations.
 Members of the Building Renovation Committee and the congregation are
 working together to update and improve many aspects of our building. The
 kitchen has already transformed. To date, \$133,000 is pledged for
 renovations that are not to exceed \$200,000.
- The Holy Spirit is active in our community. I am hearing more than ever from visitors about the warmth and meaningful worship of this congregation. Sometimes, because of a Pastor's role in planning worship, he or she is unable to experience the same level of joy and inspiration in worship experienced by those in the pew. But because of the authenticity and heart that goes into the music, prayers, fellowship and all of the elements of worship, I delight in our Sunday mornings. Our worship is a way in which God provides me the strength and inspiration to serve in the privileged role as Pastor of this congregation. I was touched when our choir felt moved to take worship outside our walls to Raton for the installation of the Rev. John McGeary. This was a generous, faithful, and missional act.

This year I had the honor of baptizing Olivia Sanchez. I also baptized Kelsie Cottril and Adam Quintana as part of our first Confirmation Class in many years. It was an honor to marry Martine Lopez and Clay Bowers. We said goodbye to Marie Allie, Martha Duran, Gilbert Medina, Frank McCoy, Bruce Cruz, Lucille Valdez, Ruth Candelaria Boleman and Adrian Archuleta. We take comfort knowing that they are in God's

everlasting love. While we said goodbye, we also welcomed Natalia Gurule, Nicole Gurule, Edna Fowler, Nicole Castellano, Kelsie Cotrill, Michael Gallegos, Shayla Bernard, Andrew Medina, Adam Quintana, Marcus Williams, and Julian Griego, into the membership of Second Church.

In 2011 we are off and running. A mission trip to Guatemala with First Church is on the horizon. So is the reception of thirteen new members, the season of Lent, and only God knows what else for 2011. I continue to serve on the Self Development of People Committee, the Committee on Preparation for Ministry of the Presbytery, the Personnel Committee of the Synod of the Southwest, and am in a year-long term as Moderator of the Presbytery of Santa Fe. I have a final project before me as a final step to complete my Doctor of Ministry Degree at Columbia Theological Seminary that you so generously support.

The river keeps flowing. As Psalm 1 suggests, "Happy are those...[who are]..like trees planted by streams of water. [Those trees]...yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper."

BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

The Building and Grounds committee, co-chaired by Gilbert Solis, Jr., and David Lopez, had an extremely busy and very productive year. Multitudes of projects were set aside by the B & G Committee to work on every month. With the help of the Congregation, a lot of work as completed on a monthly basis. An estimated 1,500 hours plus was contributed in the annual maintenance of our church.

The much needed air conditioning was installed in the Sanctuary and the balcony area during January/February. Our group installed and refurbished the kitchen area with new refrigerators, dish washers, microwaves, glass oven and new food warmers. In addition, the little bathroom in the kitchen area was converted to a new storage area, complete with lighting and shelves.

In the storage area, a new washer and dryer was also installed. In addition, new utility sinks were placed in the storage area along with the kitchen. A new storage shed was purchased and placed in the outside area up the stairs from the fellowship hall.

New carpets were installed in the Pastor's office, as well as in Pastor Yela's office. A skylight was installed in Pastor Rob's office. The Fellowship, along with the hallways, were painted and now sport a new refreshing coat of paint.

The bathrooms were also remodeled. New countertops were installed, along with new faucets, new lights and automatic on-off switches for the lights and fans. New outdoor lights were also installed in the north entry to the sanctuary and the light in the south entry was also fixed.

Some of the men got together and planted the Peace Pole in the Peace Garden. It took us all morning to dig, set forms, level and pour the concrete in place. A good cleaning and the Peace Pole looks very majestic in its setting.

Several of the cracks in the parking lot were dug up and new asphalts was used to fill in the areas. It sure is a big improvement. New signs were installed in both the north and south parking lots to indicate handicap parking. Also, a new sign for Pastor parking and visitor parking was installed. The big sign in the South parking lot was painted over, giving it a much needed new life.

In conclusion, the G & G with donations from individuals from the congregation, has a much needed ramp made by Casa de Ferro. The installation was done in November. Also a new rail for the balcony area was designed and Casa de Ferro fabricated it. It now provides much needed safety for all the people sitting in the balcony.

The Building and Grounds Committee wishes to thank all the men and women from our church that answered our call for volunteer work. Without your help, there is no way possible that all this projects could have been accomplished.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

The committee met regularly throughout the year on the 2nd Tuesday of the month. Thanks to all the committee and members of the congregation who helped in many ways with Christian Education.

Our Sunday School Superintendent Lorraine Romero and her dedicated teaching staff continue to do a tremendous job with our church youth. The teaching staff includes Olga Joyce, Gloria Montoya, Margaret Castellano, Nicole Gurule, and Emiko Chavez. There were as many as 24 students in attendance in 3 classes grouped by age. Efforts were made to get new Sunday School rooms without success. We as a congregation need to continue working to get new classrooms built or make improvements to the existing ones. In January, all of our teachers and other congregation members attended a Sexual Misconduct Avoidance Training Session at First Presbyterian Church required by the State Dept.

Vacation Bible School was held at Menaul School from Monday, June 21 to Friday, June 25, 2010. First Presbyterian, La Mesa and Camino de Vida churches joined Second Presbyterian Church with leaders primarily from Second Presbyterian Church. This event was successful and well attended.

The Christian Education Committee together with great support and leadership from Rev. Rob Woodruff conducted a confirmation class for 8 youth ages 10-14 with help from the Worship Committee and Rev. Yela. This was the first confirmation class from Second Presbyterian in several years. Various church members sponsored the confirmands. After attending several classes and a retreat at Ghost Ranch, they were confirmed during a worship service in May, 2010 and were presented with a Youth Bible provided by their sponsors.

Other activities sponsored by the Christian Education Committee were: A Talent Show and a Halloween Party with youth from First Presbyterian, San Ignacio churches and Martineztown House of Neighborly Service and others participating. Marie Kenny coordinated these events with help from Karmen & John VanDyke, as well as members of Second Presbyterian and other volunteers.

The Adult Spanish Bible Class continues on Sundays at 9:00 am with Victor Suazo and Ray Barela as leaders with 10-12 people attending. A sub-committee of the CEC continues to plan a Sunday Morning English Bible Study depending on interest. Plans to show videos owned by Harry and Jeannie Hogan titled, "That the World May Know", are part of the plans for the English Bible Class.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

The Personnel Committee was comprised of the following members: Arthur Trujillo, Frank Salazar, Esther Lopez, John VanDyke, Marty Martinez and Ruth Montoya, Chair. The Committee met five times during the year. Below, I have highlighted the areas we addressed during the year:

Pastor's Clergy Renewal Leave

Worked in concert with Pastor Rob and the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to maximize Pastor Rob's plan for his Renewal Leave. The areas included were: identifying pulpit supply and related compensation; identifying a Session Moderator, how to address Special Called Session meetings, etc. At the termination of his leave, Pastor Rob presented a report to the committee in October as per the Presbytery guidelines.

Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual

The committee continued to work diligently on revising the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual – a task that began in 2009. The first draft was presented to Session in November and was approved as a "working draft". The committee expects to present a final draft to the Session for adoption the early part of 2011.

Custodial Services

The committee terminated the custodial service contract provided by Albuquerque Janitorial and Cleaning Services as of March 25, 2010. Upon recommendations from Buildings and Grounds, it was felt that due to the extended use of the church, particularly the Fellowship Hall, additional hours were necessary. Albuquerque Janitorial was personally contacted and thanked for their services at the time of termination.

In March, Second Church entered into a contract with Mr. Frank Cavalier for 9 hours per week at a rate of \$9/hr. Mr. Cavalier is a part-time employee of Albuquerque Public Schools and was recommended to us by a member who was acquainted with his quality of work. The committee conducted a performance review with Mr. Cavalier in October. He received favorable remarks about the excellent work he is providing to Second Church.

Staff Performance Reviews

Performance reviews were conducted on each member of staff: Karmen VanDyke, Beverly Chavez, Dora Martinez and Frank Cavalier. Each individual received excellent comments.

<u>Comments from the Chair:</u> Working with this committee has been a gratifying experience. Each member was diligent in their service and a faithful participant in our discussions. Heartfelt appreciation to each.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

The first meeting in 2010 of the Worship Committee of Second Presbyterian Church was convened by Chair, Suzie Chang. Committee members were: Bob Deuble, Ruth Montoya, Beverly Chavez, organist, and Music Director, Karmen VanDyke.

With the early arrival of the Lenten Season (February), the Committee immediately began making plans for worship during this very special time in the life of the church, beginning with Palm Sunday. The Maundy Thursday service was attended by approximately 50 people. Members of the new Confirmation Class assisted the Elders with the foot washing ceremony. Worship on Good Friday included a cantata by the choir. Easter Sunday began with a chilly sunrise service in the garden area, followed by a breakfast in Fellowship Hall. The Resurrection of our Lord was celebrated at 10:30 a.m. with mariachi music leading a procession of a flower-covered cross brought forward by Trancito and Bob Romero. As people arrived, each was handed a flower with which to decorate the mesh covered wooden cross. The result was a beautiful array of color that added a festive atmosphere to the Sanctuary.

On Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd, eight young members of the Confirmation Class joined the church during a very special worship service jointly planned with the Christian Education Committee. The Confirmands were: Kelsie Cottril; Andrew Medina, Julian Griego, Adam Quintana, Shayla McIntyre, Michael Gallegos, Nicole Castellano and Marcus Williams. The Confirmands participated in the liturgy and read their Statements of Faith. Each was presented with a Bible and a red stole. A beautiful display of white paper doves appearing to be in flight, were suspended from the ceiling. The Confirmands were among a number of individuals involved in the crafting of the doves. A word of gratitude to the many members and friends who assisted in the Confirmation process.

It was a joy to schedule liturgical readers each month for the simple fact that everyone contacted was willing to participate and considered it a privilege. An effort was made to invite members of all ages, some were bilingual and willing to read in both languages; others were more comfortable reading in one language.

Lively and educational Children's Moments were lead by Suzie Chang, Marie Kenny, Lisa Esquivel, Emiko Chavez, Alyssa Quesada, Rev. Kay Huggins, Karmen VanDyke and Pastor Rob. Thanks to them for their creative efforts..

Due to health and family issues, Suzie Chang submitted her resignation from the Session and this Committee in mid-year. The committee continued to move forward in a team effort to plan for the remainder of the year.

Pastor Rob's three-month Clergy Renewal Leave began in August. The committee worked with the Personnel Committee to schedule pulpit supply during his absence beginning with Rev. Quinones, followed by Rev. Kay Huggins and lastly, by Rev. Jamie Martinez. Marie Kenny was appointed as liaison between the pastors and this committee.

Upon Pastor Rob's return, he assumed his duties as Moderator of the Presbytery. One of his early duties was the installation of the pastor at the Raton Church. Our choir was invited to provide the music for this event. Through Abel McBride's contacts, we were able to travel together in a large, comfortable bus driven by a capable chauffeur. The choir's performance was greeted with warm enthusiasm. Unfortunately, due to his mother's illness, Pastor Rob was unable to attend; however, Rev. Kay Huggins step in to take his place.

With the installation of the new ramp in November, a decision was made to exchange the locations of the organ and piano. As a result, the Session approved the expenditure of re-positioning the chimes. The Session also approved a recommendation from this committee to enhance the sound system in the nursery by adding additional speakers.

Advent Season was a busy one indeed. Purple Advent Banners replaced the green ones, other "Christmas" decorations were hung, and the Advent candles were positioned for the traditional weekly lighting by various families. The choir prepared for a performance at Menaul School's Bugg Lights; however, a heavy rain caused the event to be cancelled. As per tradition, a group of 30 members and friends gathered at the church to sing carols at about nine residences. The Christmas Eve Candlelight service included participation by a number of young people. Rev. Guillermo Yela joined Rob in the liturgy and Communion. A number of friends from Camino De Vida attended the service. December 26th brought the worship year to a close with Lessons and Carols. Special jazz music was provided by Bob Deubel, his son, Colin, and friend Allen Cordingly.

ANNUAL REPORT FROM MUSIC MINISTRY - 2010

ADULT CHOIR This has been a very satisfying year for the Adult Choir at Second Presbyterian. Not only has the choir increased in size, with the addition of Miguel Ojeda, George Huggins, Vicki Ojeda, and Sandra Duran, but strong sectional leadership has insured that new music is put together more quickly. Once again, we have often had nearly 100% present for performance. The combination of the above has created some of the best music in years! Those able to provide cantoring leadership has grown this year and included: Dora Martinez, Ruth Montoya, Art Trujillo, James Graham, Jonathon Leavitt. Solos and solos with choir were performed this year by Cisco Chavez, Carol Lopez, Gloria Mirabal, Marie Kenny, Bev Chavez, George Huggins, James Graham, Ruth Montoya.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH We are experimenting with a new format for children and youth choirs. The enriched program currently begins at 9:15 with mid high youth who wish to prepare solos and ensembles for worship. This piece has been especially successful for four faithful mid high boys (and, at times, two mid high girls). They are joined at 9:30 by all other children and prepare special music which includes "all ages". At 9:45, beginning in September, Miguel Ojeda provided leadership in traditional, Spanish texted music. This program has allowed children and youth to sing "Padre Nuestro" ("The Lord's Prayer") for World Communion and two Spanish selections for the Christmas Eve service. The congregation has valued the bilingual efforts; we will soon evaluate its "success" with the participants.

It has been especially satisfying to have an increasing amount of "special instrumental music" provided by our youth. This year Gabriel Van Dyke, clarinet, Avrey Montoya, piano, and Julian Griego, piano, each provided offertories, as well as adult musicians, Jonathon Leavitt, French horn, and Bob Deuble, guitar. Youth Andrew Medina and adults Tilda Chavez, Dolores Romero, Dora Martinez, Bob Deuble, and Miguel Ojeda have all enhanced music with percussion. Hand chimes played Palm Sunday and Christmas Eve. Guest musicians from "outside" Second Presbyterian included: Joy Bohning, flute, and Joy with John Truitt on recorder and saxophone; Hillary Higgins, violin, and Hillary with cellist Celeste Power; Bonnie Husler, trumpet; Glenn Flanders, trumpet, with John Husler, euphonium; Linnea Rowley, oboe; Donese Mayfield, harp, with Bonnie Dill, flute; jazz musicians Colin Deuble and Allen Cordingly. Mariachi Nuevo Sonido provided Easter leadership, and youth mariachi, Mariachi Luna y Sol, under the direction of Miguel Ojeda, provided offertory and fellowship music during a summer worship.

ASH WEDNESDAY: Ash Wednesday service, with combined leadership from First and Second Presbyterian, was hosted by Second Presbyterian.

GOOD FRIDAY: A cantata was the centerpiece for Good Friday worship.

EASTER: Mariachi Nuevo Sonido led the musical portions of Easter 2010.

CHOIR FESTIVAL: The choir participated well in the Church of the Good Shepherd (UCC) Choir Festival.

SUMMER: Adult choir received a summer hiatus. Musical leadership was provided by a women of the choir ensemble, Children's Choir, Los Alabadores, men of the church ensemble, Ruth Montoya, Dora Martinez and Bev Chavez, and James Graham. In each of these, leadership included responses and congregational leadership, as well as "special music"/anthems.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL: Karmen was asked to coordinate music for the joint Vacation Church School with First Presbyterian, and both La Mesa and Camino de Vida musicians shared in providing music. Pastors Rob Woodruff and Paul

Debenport "entertained" on two evenings.

HISPANIC CONCERT: This was the first year since 2003 in which there was no Hispanic Concert. (It would have been our 8th Annual.) It does not appear it was missed.

RATON INSTALLATION: An invitation to provide music for the Installation of John McGarey, as Pastor for 1st Presbyterian Raton, on Christ the King Sunday, led to a "first of its kind" bus trip. (Yes, we finally went on the road.) Abel McBride organized the details, and both the Women's Association and Men of the Church provided funding to make the transportation financially reasonable for the choir. The worship responsibilities and the trip provided a great experience for all.

CAROLING: Once again, the choir was the core group for the pastoral ministry of caroling shut-ins and others. We were able to send out three groups this year and

covered the largest ever geographical area.

schedule, but was rained out.

CHRISTMAS EVE: Christmas Eve's worship was the most successfully bilingual of any worship we've done in the past 15 years, aided by the children's Spanish contributions.

LESSONS AND CAROLS: A jazz trio provided musical leadership throughout the service. It made for a very joyful finish to our Christmas celebrations.

PERSONNEL

We have appreciated the leadership of Lisa Esquibel in the Children and Youth Choir program. Lisa is moving to Denver, and we will miss her! Lillian Sanchez continues to support the children and youth musical efforts; thank you, Lillian. Thank you also to parent Iris Sandoval, who always willingly rises to the occasion on behalf of the Children's Choir.

The addition of Miguel Ojeda has added wonderful possibilities for the

children/youth of the church. We hope he will continue to be available to us.

Beverly Chavez plays organ for worship and chooses hymns for most services. Karmen Van Dyke leads choir and ensemble rehearsals and plays keyboard for most worship services.

This year, as always, it was great to work with Rob Woodruff, and with sabbatical clergy leadership Jaime Quinones, Kay Huggins, Jamie Martinez, each of whom were creative in their approach(es) and enthusiastic about integrating music into worship planning.

Thank you to the congregation who generously expresses its appreciation for the time and calent all participants bring to worship at Second Presbyterian Church.
