

A Global Feast

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

We at Second Church relish our annual celebration of World Communion Sunday. That will be true this upcoming October 2nd. World Communion Sunday was dreamt up in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr, the pastor of Shadyside Presbyterian Church. The original intent of the Sunday is the recognition that the sacred meal we partake of is the same feast celebrated in churches all over the world. It began as a Presbyterian notion but has been adopted by many denominations through the years. It is a celebration of unity in Christ, something churches often lack. The letter to the community at Ephesus boldly proclaims in chapter 4, that when it comes to Jesus Christ, there is "one faith, one Lord, and one baptism." It is one passage of many that emphasizes the importance of Christian unity. And one to which we might add "one communion." The letter to the Ephesians highlights the same unity we lift up that morning.

Besides celebrating the joy of the universal meal, we will have a special surprise for the life of our church community that you will not want to miss! Also, that morning marks my thirteenth anniversary as pastor of Second Church. That joy will certainly be present in my mind and heart as we break bread together. The week before, Don Bixby, Jack & Anna Torres, and myself, will share in that same global meal at the Central Reformed Presbyterian Church in Matanzas, Cuba. We give thanks for, among other things, Second Church's commitment to relationships in the Albuquerque community, and in other places world-wide. We look forward to sharing about the journey to our sister church on World Communion when we return.

Matanzas Central Presbyterian Church, Province of Matanzas, Matanzas, Cuba

Matanzas Central Presbyterian church (MCPC) is an urban church, in downtown Matanzas City, Cuba, comprised of people from all over the city, including some marginal and peripheral neighborhoods. This is a very diverse congregation by age, education, social configuration, and ethno-cultural backgrounds (African descendants, Koreans descendants, and European descendants). There are 82 members, with typically 90 worshipers on Sunday. MCPC is a very committed and joyful congregation.

MCPC has a long standing tradition of <u>Christian witness</u> through the proclamation of the word of God, worship, and Christian education. For this church, the biblical and theological formation of its membership has been one of its main concerns throughout the years. Pastoral care and service to the community through different projects and programs have been a must for this church

For almost 2 decades the women's group have developed a <u>diaconal program with seniors from the</u> <u>community</u>, providing breakfast for 15 seniors every Saturday. Women have also provided cloth and hygienic bags from time to time. Right now this program has grown in number and service. Lunch is provided every Saturday for seniors from the community and the church. At present, MCPC is very focused on the ministry with children and adolescents. Some of them come to church with relatives, others are from marginal neighborhoods. One of these neighborhoods is far away from church; so we pick them up in our minibus (a Toyota Coaster, 19 seats, from the 90s) every Sunday. We offer them a light snack between Sunday school and the worship service. The bus returns them after service.

High school ministry. More than 1000 students attend this school, which is in front of our church building. For two years we were praying and looking for God's signs to see what MCPC could do to serve this school. Finally, the idea for a tutoring program came and from October 5th, more than 20 students, from 10th grade, come every day to our church to receive tutoring on Math, Chemistry, Physics, History and Spanish. After this program started we have received lots more of applications but because of the lack of room, we are not able



to extent the number of students. We are committed to serve these students until they finish 12th grade and do the national test to enter to the university.

Missionary or evangelistic focus. In 2006 the church founded four missions in two Eastern provinces: Moa, Marcané, and Holguín congregations in Holguin Province; and Manatí congregation in Las Tunas province. From time to time, the pastors and an elder visit them. Every year, their leaders come to Matanzas for pastoral and biblical training at the Seminary and in our Church. Right now there is a member of our church, who belong to Holguin church who is ministering these 4 missions.

Music. In the last few months, a worship band is animating the worship service. Guitars, a soloist, a pianist, come together and are bringing a new life and joy to the worship's service music. In the fall MCPC was able to hire a musician who is working with the children's choir. However, the ministry of the music needs more support. MCPC is also looking for volunteers from overseas to help on this important ministry.



The Youth have a big event coming up November 12, and we could use some help! Our plan is to create a USO Canteen to entertain "the troops"! The "troops" consist of all the Veterans that attend Second Church plus their families. We envision our canteen to look like one of the weigh stations that were present all over the United States during WWII - a safe place where soldiers could go to socialize and relax before shipping out to the war in Europe or South East Asia. We want to provide food - sandwiches, cookies, pastries, and, those war

time staples, coffee and Coca Cola. So far that is looking easy. Now we get to the hard part. We want to teach our kids to jitterbug and swing dance and even a slow dance thrown in for good measure. We will have a "Dance Party" after church on October 23. If you can help us teach kids to dance (a skill that, unfortunately, Mr. Chang and I are lacking - I know, you thought we could do everything!), please let us know! This could be a really fun hour or two! We will feed you pizza and other goodies in return for your sharing your expertise!



And a Great Big Thank You to all those who helped make our Sep 18 Chinese Dinner a huge success! We raised nearly \$800! This will a big help as our coffers were running a tad low from our summer Mission Trips. And a Big Thank You to Anita Chavez who saw to it that our kids were quite fashionably dressed in new T-Shirts!
