

"Growing the Garden"

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

One of my favorite biblical metaphors is that of a garden. The Bible uses it as an ideal venue for human dwelling. God created the heavens and the earth, and placed humanity in a garden to live in harmony with God and creation. Things went well, until Adam and Eve broke the one rule God had placed on their garden existence. The result of consuming the forbidden fruit was eviction from the garden. We might say that ever since, humanity has toiled to try and work its way back into the garden. In a world that beholds both beauty and brokenness, in order to obtain the latter, we must rely heavily on grace. But we must also work to cultivate meaningful, healthy growth for ourselves and others—all in obedience to our Creator.

Garden as metaphor can be allegorically applied to many situations, but I see it as an excellent image for a church. The church as a garden seeks to cultivate faith, hope, and love to the point of overflowing into the world around it. A healthy church means a faithful and cooperative enterprise that generates a harvest blessed by God that spiritually and even sometimes physically, feeds those both inside and outside its walls. In a world that is often cutthroat, a church serves as an alternative community that models the love-ethic of Jesus Christ. Second Church is indeed blessed to be a growing garden of faith. It is a garden replete with people of tremendous talents and generous with their time and treasures. This, with God's grace, has led it to become a flourishing garden.

In this season of stewardship, we are afforded time for reflection about this garden in which we worship, fellowship, and mission. The stewardship committee, the session, and your pastors see the continued promise for the growth of the garden. For five weeks, you will hear thoughtful testimonies from church members during worship, as they name the way the fruits of the garden impact them. In meeting with the stewardship committee and those who will be giving testimonies, vibrant worship, growing youth and children's ministries, and expanding mission initiatives were consistently the most appreciated fruits of the Second Church garden. But many more were named. And I believe many opportunities exist to continue healthily growing those fruits.

In The Beginning......

"On January 27, 1889, according to the records in the first minutes of Second Church, a committee of two ministers, Rev. James A. Menaul and Rev. Jose Ynes Perea, appointed by the Presbytery of Santa Fe, which met in Socorro, New Mexico, gathered with a group of people in the adobe residence of Senor Epifanio Arreola. Here they organized the Albuquerque Spanish Church, now Second Presbyterian Church (USA),..."



"The church was organized with fifteen members who were examined, baptized and partook of the Lord's Supper in that service. Twenty-two became charter members. The charter members were as follows: Miguel Martinez, Trinidad Martinez, José Martinez Durán, José Martin y Candelaria, Martin Durán, Marfa Duran, Isidora C. Chavez, María de Jesus C. Garcia, Rasaura Velasquez, Clara Martinez, Librada Martinez, Laura Martinez, William Dauber,

Luisa Martinez, Manuel Fernandez. By letter were: Epifanio Arreola and Guadalupe Burgan Arreola and five of their children."
