The liturgical season is resetting. We have arrived at Advent, the beginning of the liturgical calendar and the season leading up to Christmas. Advent encapsulates the four Sundays that precede the birth of the Christ-child. This year, the season is the longest it can possibly be since Christmas falls on a Sunday. I am delighted to share that our Advent theme is music. Music has a way of speaking to the soul, and as we await the hope of the coming messiah, we will engage our souls with the sounds of the season and the lyrics will be ancient biblical utterances from seasonal characters like John the Baptist and Mary.

Anthems, sermons, and liturgy will embrace our musical theme and worship will include weekly guest musicians. Their musical contributions will begin before worship officially starts, so you may encounter music when you walk into the sanctuary. Above you read a quote from Protestant Reformer Martin Luther about music. But philosophers see the value of music just as much as theologians. Twenty-four hundred years ago, Plato wrote that, "Music is a moral law. It gives soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination, and charm and gaiety to life and to everything." My prayer is that the through the soul-giving medium of music, God's Word and Spirit will capture us with hope, in this season that leads to the birth of Jesus. May we hear it in all of its depth, but may we also sing in this season. "He who sings, prays twice," wrote St. Augustine. The Good News of Jesus' coming most be sounded out. He is the long-awaited messiah who bring hope to the world. We will celebrate his coming during Advent with music. That sounds good!

The Session of Second Presbyterian Church held its monthly Session on Tuesday November 15, 2016. The following actions were taken:

1. **VOTED** to fund sending youth leaders, Susie and Frances Chang, to the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators Conference January 28-30, 2017.

2. <u>VOTED</u> to sign the Partnership Agreement between the Matanzas Central Presbyterian Church (MCPC) of Mantanzas, Province of Mantanzas, Cuba and Second Presbyterian Church.

3. From the Second Presbyterian Church Presbyterian Men's Group:

Whereas, we are a connectional church, and desire to create, maintain, and foster relationships with other congregations, Session <u>VOTED</u> to schedule four ruling elders, as many members from the Presbyterian Men's group, and the congregation as wish to go, to visit the following churches:

- a. Sunday, February 12, 2017 Smith Memorial United Church in Truchas, NM
- b. Sunday, June 11, 2017 Emmanuel Presbyterian Church in Peñasco, NM
- c. Sunday, October 8, 2017 Embudo Presbyterian Church in Dixon, NM

ADVENT SEASON IS UPON US PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD!

Second Presbyterian Church is planning and preparing for the season of Advent which begins on Sunday, November 27. Please refer to the list of activities noted below and plan to join us for worship.

Throughout the four Sundays of the Advent Season, THE CONGREGATION IS ENCOURAGED to ARRIVE AT CHURCH BY 10:20 A.M. and to prayerfully take their seat. Along with the Bulletin, you will receive a prayer card to serve as a resource for reflection while guest musicians provide special music.

NOVEMBER 27 – FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Following the time for prayer and reflection at 10:30 a.m., we will be called to worship by the lighting of the first Advent Candle, the Candle of Hope. In the same manner, the Candles of Peace, Joy and Love, will be lit the next three Sundays.

• <u>Hanging of the Greens and Advent Wreath Workshop</u> will take place following the benediction. Those wishing to participate in decorating the sanctuary, gather around the Communion Table for a brief liturgy and the singing of a Christmas carol. Others wishing to take part in the workshop will move into Fellowship Hall where an area will be designated for that purpose. Coffee and refreshments will be available in Fellowship Hall.

 <u>Advent Devotional Booklets, "From Heaven to Manger"</u> are available on the table at the main entrance. Please take one per household. The daily readings call us not only to <u>pray</u>, to <u>think</u>, <u>but</u> also to <u>act</u> (each day will have a different suggestion about something special you can do for some one or yourself and your family during this season.

DECEMBER 11 – ALL CHURCH CHRISTMAS CAROLING

Come and join in the joyous ministry of caroling to our shut-ins and to those members who are unable to attend worship on a regular basis. There will be a sign-up sheet in Fellowship Hall on December 4. Thanks to Marie Kenny and Nancy Montoya who are once more coordinating this effort. Carolers will gather after worship in Fellowship Hall for a soup luncheon and to receive directions along with your team names. All age groups are welcome!

In The Beginning......

"Our very first Pastor was the Reverend John Menaul, MD. He served us from 1889 to 1904. He was an ordained minister, as well as a medical doctor. He was also the brother of the Reverend James Menaul, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church here in Albuquerque.

Reverend John Menaul came to us from the missionary field in Corsica, Africa. He had gone there with his wife, Harriet McMecham, and two daughters. They were there for three years, when his wife became very ill and died. The whole family was stricken with the same disease, but only the mother died.

When he and his daughters were well enough to travel, they returned to the United States. No sooner had he arrived in this country when he was encouraged by the Reverend Sheldon Jackson, the Synodical Missionary of all the Western Territory, to consider coming out West to work among the Indians. He accepted the offer and he and his two girls came out west to take a job with the Navajo Indians at Fort Defiance, in what is now Arizona.

There he met another missionary by the name of Miss Charity Ann Gaston. Those of you that attended Allison-James School in Santa Fe, will remember a boy's dormitory, Gaston Hall. The hall was across the highway from the main campus. That building was named after her.

It wasn't long before Reverend Menaul and Charity Ann decided to get married, for the young girls needed a mother to look after them. Soon after their marriage, they were transferred to take over the Presbyterian work at Laguna Indian Pueblo in the Territory of New Mexico. Here Reverend Menaul made use of his other talents. He built a schoolhouse and became one of the teachers. School books were very rare and he decided that it would be easier for the Indian children to learn to read in their own Keresean language.

The Laguna Indians didn't have a written language so he translated the widely used McGuffy reader into their language, which he had to learn first. He also owned a printing press and printed some books for the students to use. In addition to all this, he became their physician and shared the doctoring with the village Medicine Man. Because of all his talents, he and Charity Ann were well thought of and admired. The locals were amused at the couple's difference in stature. She was very tall for a woman and he was barely five feet tall. (One might say, the first Mutt and Jeff)

After fourteen years in the Laguna field, Rev. John Menaul was asked by his brother, Rev. James Menaul, the Pastor at the Presbyterian Church in Albuquerque to take over the newly organized Presbyterian Church In Los Martinez. Rev. James Menaul had been appointed as the Synodical Missionary to replace Reverend Sheldon Jackson. He was asked to take the job because he was also fluent in the Spanish language. The first job was to get a church building built. He and the whole Barrio took on the task and made all the adobes. They did all the work and they soon had their own building, but the church steeple had no bell in the tower.

The wagon train of trade goods came down by way of the "Camino Real" which passed through the Barrio of Los Martinez. We now know that Edith Boulevard, where Second Presbyterian church is located, was the original "Camino Real." When it was learned that the traders had a bell for sale, the Barrio people wanted to purchase the bell. The traders said the bell was for a church further north and they could not sell it to the Barrio people. A few days passed, and the traders came back. They still had the bell with them. They told the people that the church up north did not have the money to purchase it and they were heading home. The people of the Barrio rallied and the bell was purchased from the traders. The bell was transferred to the present bell tower in 1922, when the present building was built. That bell is well over one hundred years old.

The Reverend John Menaul put his printing press to good use again by printing religious tracts into the Spanish language. These tracts were distributed to Spanish Fields from Puerto Rico, Mexico and the Philippines. That printing press was donated to Menaul School when he retired and was later lost in a fire at the school. Reverend Menaul and Charity Ann stayed for our first fifteen years. He finally decided to retire in 1904. He and his wife went to Oklahoma to live with one of their daughters. Charity Ann passed on in 1906 and Reverend Menaul in 1907. They had started out with a solid Christian foundation."

We express our thanks to the Nominating Committee members for their energy, hard work and persistence.


