

# "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." Romans 12:12

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

One of the great gifts of the faith is: **renewal**. Renewal seemingly steeps ever corner of the faith. Throughout the Old Testament, God demonstrates a tremendous patience for the Israelites' tendency to break covenants. Time and again, God allows them to be renewed. Sabbath is one of the Ten Commandments, and permeates Hebrew law—building in time for people, and land, to regenerate. In the New Testament, Jesus' life, death, and resurrection are themselves a process of renewal, and He, by the grace of God (the Father), becomes the final covenant. The Good News is a narrative of renewal and our worship has built-in points of renewal every Sunday. We confess to be renewed. We leave something behind in order to engage something new. And we know that on those Sundays we arrive with a weary soul, we have hope to be touched and renewed by God's Spirit.

I am aware of many in our congregation and the community ready for renewal. Because of their personal and wider realities, it seems like more than any year in recent memory, a lot of folks have told me, "I cannot wait for 2017 to arrive." Even though our Gregorian based calendar is not scripturally based, it does build in a natural time to reset. I pray that we may all find renewal in the coming year. Presbyterian and Pulitzer prize winner Pearl S. Buck, wrote, "Inside myself is a place where I live all alone and that is where I renew my springs that never dry up." May each of us find that place so that our springs may be renewed, and we may live even more faithfully and abundantly in 2017!

#### <u>MISSION – Anna Torres</u>



An information meeting about the May 29-June 5, 2017, Guatemala Mission Trip will be held on January 15, 2017, 12:15 pm at First Presbyterian Church. If you are interested in finding out more about this semi-annual trip, please plan to attend.

#### More from Mission:

- An Interface Service will be held at Camino de Vida on January 25, 2016. Various community churches are scheduled to participate.
- Discussion was held on the upcoming mission trip to Guatamala. The dates for this trip are May 27-June 5, 2016. Ciria Yela is planning on going to provide dental services to the people in Guatamala. Her tentative plan is to meet with people needing dental services on the first day and then scheduling appointments throughout the rest of the week. Stephanie Kremel is planning on going on this trip and hopes to recruit other members from First Presbyterian Church to go, also. A "General Interest" meeting will be held on January 15 at First Presbyterian Church to try to recruit members from both Second Presbyterian and First Presbyterian Churches. Don Bixby suggested we include this information in both our newsletter and Sunday morning service bulletin. The estimated cost for this trip is \$1500 per person. On previous trips, each person participating commits to pay a certain amount and the balance is provided through fund raising
- The Mission Networking Committee is planning an anti-racism training to be held on March 31 and April 1 in Albuquerque.
- The Young Adult Volunteer Program will bring youth volunteers to Albuquerque in the upcoming year. Second Presbyterian Church hopes to receive a volunteer who may assist with the Family Promise program. Cost for this volunteer is \$9,000 for the year. The mission committee is budgeting \$1500 towards this cost, pending Session approval. Family Promise would have to provide a budget for this volunteer position.
- The Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Program is hosting a soiree honoring 2017 scholarship recipients and scholarship sponsors. This reception is scheduled for January 4, 2017 from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM at CNM Workforce Training Center in Albuquerque. Martha Powers, Anna Torres and Jack Torres will attend. The recipient of the \$1,000 scholarship provided by Second Presbyterian Church for 2017 is Angeles Ruby Guzman of Manzano High School.



Winter Wednesday Adult Bible Study

Jan 11-Mar 1, 2017, 11 am to Noon - Fellowship Hall

"Who is the Son of Man?" - Rev. Dr. Kay Huggins, Instructor The central question of the Gospel of Matthew is: Who is the Son of Man? This is the title Jesus gives to himself — however, he does not define the title. It is the task of every one of his followers to search out the meaning of that title for themselves.

#### Highlights of the Cuba Adventure - Don Bixby

After visiting with Cuban *pastors Ary and Beidy* last summer, I was intrigued by plans for an agriculture program at the Demari Ecological Retreat Center as an extension of their outreach in Matanzas. Cubans have had to adapt their agriculture from chemical and fossil fuel dependent on Soviet imports, to systems using sustainable methods. Pastor Rob, Jack and Anna Torres and I were part of a group of 15 people from the Presbytery of Santa Fe traveling to partner churches in Cuba in September. We flew to Miami and then on to Cuba. The Havana Jose' Marti Airport is a single story building with movable stairways for deplaning. We loaded our mountain of luggage and boarded a *Pastor for Peace* bus. Painted as though for a 1960's rock band, it was easy to spot and generated lots of roadside cheers and enthusiasm.

The older part of Havana, location of First Presbyterian Church, has narrow one way streets and tiny sidewalks. Most buildings had balconies filled with kids, dogs, caged birds, plants and laundry. Wooden doors were covered with elaborate ironwork and opened into living rooms. Besides pedestrians, the streets were filled with shiny (or not) 60-70 year old cars, pedicabs, horse-drawn taxis and carts, and vendors of vegetables, fruit and bread. Along with the relaxed and comfortable attitude of the Cubans, there was a great feeling of intimacy and safety. At First Presbyterian Church we had Bible study, observed volunteers hosting an open sanctuary for the community every day, as well as the library, Tai Chi class, group and individual counseling. The programs are an outreach to the community and many participants were not members of the church.

In Matanzas, the worship service was very familiar and we felt embraced by newly met brothers and sisters. We brought a communion set produced by a Laguna Pueblo potter that was well received. We attended bible study in parishioners' homes, a jewelry making group, a high school tutoring class, an English class and other outreach programs. Of special interest to me was the *Living Waters* system that purifies truck-delivered water with filters as fine as 3 microns, half the size of a red blood cell, and then sanitized with ultraviolet light generators. While Jack and Anna stayed at the church, Rob and I stayed about 8 blocks away. We had the chance to walk the neighborhood and both observe and be part of the on-going street energy. One night there was a celebration with streamers across the streets, soup kettles over open fires, cakes, dogs, kids and music until the wee hours.

The city stretches along a river and a beautiful bay. High ridges give a commanding view of the city, shoreline and countryside. The seminary is sited on one ridge, while on the other side is the Demari Ecological Center. The center serves as a retreat for spiritual renewal and ecological education. More sustainable farming practices have already resulted in better dairy production, and the recharging of former springs. Production will increase as cheese making is adding value to the milk, adding sheep better utilizes pasture and produces lamb for market, and planting orange trees increases food production.

While still examining the experiences of this trip, exploration of our partnership with Central Church of Matanzas and Demari is needed for a deeper understanding of what has been accomplished and what might still be attained.

- 6. **VOTED** to approve the 2017 Communion schedule as presented by the Worship Committee.



#### In The Beginning......

Our second Pastor was the Reverend Dr. Henry C. Thompson.

He was born in Hanover, Indiana. His father was a professor of mathematics at Hanover College for thirty years. With that background, he was destined to enroll in Hanover College, which he did, and graduated in 1861. He returned to the college to teach Latin and Greek for two years. He fought in the Civil War for five months. He entered Princeton Seminary in 1864 after his discharge from the militia.

After graduating from Seminary he was faced with looking for a field in which to serve. He joined two others who had decided to go to Mexico as Missionaries for the Presbyterian Church. He went in 1873, and along with another Missionary, opened up work in Jeres, Mexico.



It wasn't long before he realized that the only way they were going to make real progress there, was to train native Mexican laymen to the ministry. So he opened up a Presbyterian Seminary in San Luis Potosi for the local Mexican converts. He later taught in a Presbyterian Seminary in Mexico City.

While in Mexico city, he began writing for the Presbyterian publication "La Antorcha Evangelista". In 1885, he became the editor of the publication "El Faro" and later started a publication of his own called "El Farolito" and began an editorial debate with the local Catholic Church. After spending twenty years in Mexico, he returned to the United States in 1893. He was immediately recruited to the Presbyterian College in Del Norte, Colorado. He taught seminary courses at the college. He was well suited for the job he was recruited for in Colorado, since he had spent the last twenty years teaching.

The school was soon closed and moved to Menaul School here in Albuquerque. He was placed in charge of the College after his move. When the Presbyterian Church thought it would be better to send the students to regular Presbyterian Colleges and Seminaries, he was asked to take over the Spanish Presbyterian Church in Los Martinez. When Rev. John Menaul retired, Rev. Thompson accepted the job and began his work in Los Martinez in 1905. He stayed for two years. He then accepted a post with the American Bible Society as a translator of Spanish religious materials.

While at Menaul School, he had trained for the ministry several of our future Pastors, namely, Juan Baros, Victorian Valdez, Acorcinio Lucero, Juan Quintana, Benedicto Sandoval and Melecio Trujillo. Only Benedicto and Melecio did not become ordained pastors, but served the Church as laymen preachers.
