SECOND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH SESSION STATED MEETING March 21, 2017

The Session of Second Presbyterian Church met for a regular meeting on Tuesday, March 21, 2017 in Fellowship Hall. After prayer at 5:25 by Rev. Robert Woodruff, Session shared a potluck dinner, and RE Reme Molo lead the Session in devotions and prayer. Moderator Rob Woodruff called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m.

Session **APPROVED** the agenda by unanimous consent.

Session **VOTED** to grant privilege of the floor to Luke Rembold, Youth and Young Adult Ministry (YAV) Coordinator for the Presbytery of Santa Fe, for purposes of hearing his introduction and conversing with him concerning the duties of his positon.

YOUTH LEADERS' REPORT - Susie & Francis Chang

Junction as a donation. They gave 6 large plastic bags filled with clothes and personal items! Joy Junction was discussed during their Sunday School time the week before with Eugenia Bencomo teaching the class. Kudos to Eugenia for her leadership!

We had 10 kids and 6 adults participate. The number of small children was rather disappointing at first but then our kids got into the reason we were there and started sharing their expertise with anyone interested in learning how to create balloon shapes and animals. We also took sugar cookies for kids to decorate and that was a big hit. Our kids took the decorated cookies around the huge room, offering treats to anyone who wanted one.

We were there approximately 1 ½ hours and it was quite the adventure! Our Annual Mother's Day Gourmet Pancake Breakfast is still a go. The funds raised from this event will help facilitate the Mission Trip to Carlsbad in June, which currently has 12 youth scheduled to go.

Rev. Rob Woodruff:

- 1. Reported on the visits he has made since the last report, and updated Session on the status of some that he visited.
- 2. Reported that the Taquería, that submits a fee to us to park in our South parking lot, had a pickup truck stolen on Saturday morning, and another had a broken windshield. The thieves were caught. Session requested that Building and Grounds inquire to our Security service on any possible ways to improve coverage of the South parking lot by our security cameras.
- 3. Suggested that an All-church photo would be appropriate with a possible date of May 7. Session **VOTED** to designate Sunday, May 7, 2017, as the day for the photo and requested the Membership Committee to arrange the details.
- 4. Reported that he is working with the Personnel Committee to update the Pastor's job description.
- 5. Reported that he will providing pulpit services in the Ancho Community Presbyterian Church and Corona Presbyterian Church, in Corona, NM, on April 30, 2017.
- 6. Stated that he is considering attending *The Festival of Homiletics*, to be held in San Antonio, TX, May 15-19, 2017.

Occasionally made adds/edits to Instant Church Directory (ICD), which are propagated to the app. Assist with an occasional request for support of installation and activation of the app.

FACEBOOK

One post reached 81 readers.

NEWSLETTER

213 copies of the March newsletter (NL) were mailed at the bulk mailing rate. Expense for paper and ink was \$56.00. Two of us, along with three late arrivals, completed folding and taping in 80 minutes. Distribution of the PDF version of the NL via the email group went to 61. Still researching cheapest and easiest method of printing. \$30.56 of postage paid thru bulk mailing account at Post Office, which required renewal of bulk mailing account with \$250.00 payment.

WEBSITE

Updated HOME page with current activities and added documents to pages that require LOG IN.

BUDGET

"Newsletter Postage" is red, PO required \$225 to renew the bulk mail account. Monthly postage is about \$31, so seven months are "prepaid".

OTHER

Continued posting "agenda" style calendar to bulletin boards around the building. Purchase 2TB USB drive for storage of the complete worship videos. Only excerpts are posted to the website. The full length worship video is approximately 12GB.

4. Evangelism & Membership – Pat Gilberto

The committee met on Tuesday, March15. In attendance were Beverly Chavez, Phyllis Nunns, Pat Gilberto, and Susan Romero Chavez.

We discussed plans for the 2017 year. They include the following:

- Updating membership lists
- Honoring the 90+ year olds who are members and those who have been members of 2nd Church for more than 50 years. We would request two dates from the worship committee for summer recognitions. Already have pins, thanks to Abel McBride. May 7 is Older Adults week. Probably celebrate the 90+ on May 7.
- Possibly setting up a new members' class this spring.
- The updating of the Memorial plaque.

5. Mission – Anna Torres

Members present at March 15 meeting: Anna Torres, Pastor Rob Woodruff, Martha Powers, Alicia Gilliam and Maria Martinez.

- Twelve people are scheduled to attend the trip to Guatemala on May 30. Three people will attend from Second Presbyterian Church are Abel McBride, Martha Powers and Pastor Rob Woodruff. Three people from Camino de Vida and six from First Presbyterian Church will also be attending. Some of the work they will be doing while in Guatemala is providing dental clinics and building chicken coops. Commissioning at Second Presbyterian Church is scheduled for May 28. Fundraising to assist with costs for the trip and to purchase supplies will be held, if approved by the Session. A stock sale is being proposed where shares will be sold during fellowship hours after church.
- Curriculum for Sunday School was requested by Pastor Beidy at our partner church in Matanzas, Cuba. Anna Torres was able to download curriculum to a thumb drive and sent to Cuba with cousins traveling to Cuba on March 15.
- Mission Committee voted to support the New Mexico Coalition for Immigrant Justice by awarding the agency with \$250.
- Mission Committee voted to support *Circo for the Community*, a New Mexico Conference of Churches Benefit Event on April 1, 2017 from 6:00 to 8:00 P.M. The event includes a reception, dinner, organization presentations and jazz. The committee voted to spend \$250 to buy "a table of 8" for the event. Proceeds will benefit the following organizations:
 - o Migrant Services of Catholic Charities
 - New Mexicans to Prevent Gun Violence
 - New Mexico Interfaith Power and Light
 - o Interfaith Hunger Coalition
 - o Mujeres en Accion
- We are concerned that the First Sunday food donation has not been supported as well as it could be. The committee recommended the inclusion of an announcement in the church bulletin more regularly and Pastor Rob suggested bringing in Brad Brown to do a Minute for Mission on Sunday morning.
- Mission Committee has agreed to prepare and deliver sack lunches for 30-35 volunteers for Habitat for Humanity at a cost of \$75-\$85. The Mission Committee plans on serving these lunches during the month that we do not provide casseroles for Project Share. The fourth Saturday of the month in May is May 27th and the committee will provide sack lunches on that day.

- Ruth Montoya is scheduled to open the church facility for WINGS for Life Program in April.
- Volunteers from Second Presbyterian Church will prepare casseroles for the homeless and low income on Saturday, April 22 and deliver them to St. Martin's in support of Project Share.

Session **VOTED** to hold a stock sale to raise funds for the mission trip to Guatemala.

6. <u>Hospitality</u> – Martha Powers

- <u>Project Share</u> Alicia Montoya and Tina Griego helped with shopping and will bring food. The food will be stored in the kitchen until it is needed, and will include food containers (cardboard trays), which should be kept (not to be disposed).
