NEWSLETTER

214 copies of the March newsletter (NL) were mailed at the bulk mailing rate. Printing at the Presbytery office was \$33.10. Distribution of the PDF version of the NL via the email group went to 62. Still researching cheapest and easiest method of printing. \$30.35 of postage paid thru bulk mailing account at Post Office. CORRECTION: bulk mailing account renewal was \$225.00, not \$250.00 as reported last month. The annual fee was not included in the 2017 Budget request for LW.

We received a \$50 donation from Presbyterian Women to our Sunday School, and will work to spend it wisely.

7. <u>Stewardship & Finance – Ruth Montoya, John Van Dyke</u>

The first meeting of the Stewardship and Finance Committee was held on March 28. The agenda included a financial review and sharing preliminary ideas to better promote an ongoing spirit of stewardship and gratitude within our congregation. All agreed that stewardship is not confined to just money, but a more holistic attitude that involves our time and talents. We are continuing this conversation in our future meetings in an effort to create ideas about effective ways to inform our congregation concerning our mission and ministry projects. We trust that this will result in engaging more members - both young and more mature types, to become involved in an area of interest to them. Our discussion included the four church-wide offerings and the related funding projects. Session **VOTED** to donate our portion (40%) of the Pentecost Offering to Family Promise.
