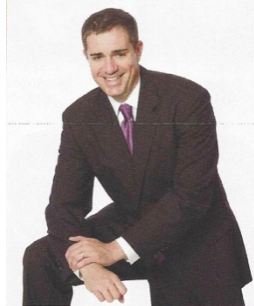

Lenten Joy?

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Is it permissible to rejoice during Lent? Would that not be antithetical to the self-improvement, self-denial, and for some, the self-punishment of the season? Scripturally, Lent begins with Jesus' challenging 40 days in the wilderness, during which he is plagued by thirst and tempted by the devil. And it concludes with Jesus' painful death on the cross. If there is a liturgical season that would seem devoid of joy, it is this one. And yet, we might cue Paul, from Philippians 4: 4: "Rejoice in the Lord **always**, again I say rejoice."

I have shared with you before about "risus paschalis," the "Easter laugh." Risus paschalis is a tradition rooted in the musings of early church "fathers" like Augustine and Chrysostom, the latter who preached a sermon in the 4th century portraying a vision of Christ confronting the devil and laughing. This has led to traditions of humor in various corners of the church, all predicated on the idea that through the resurrection, God played a trick on the devil. The devil thought he had won with the crucifixion, but we all know different. This is an ideal year to bring this up since Easter falls on April Fools' Day.

In their Christian Century article, "Rejoice in the Lord always—and Especially in Lent," Miraslov Volf and Drew Collins suggest that the reason we engage this season by distancing ourselves from what we enjoy, does not keep those things from being enjoyable. The goodness of creation does not cease to be good just because we take time to retreat from it. In their words, "Because it is in denying ourselves that which we want, perhaps even that which we think we need, that we learn to see that the world's goodness is not a consequence of our enjoyment of the goods of the world; rather, our deep enjoyment of them is the consequence of their goodness."

A fundamental objective of our faith, that is easily missed, is to live into the reality that we are not the center of the world. We are not ultimately consumers of God for our own sakes. Any closeness to God does not imply our possession of God. Rather, God created us, and our lives are part of a larger narrative that is about truth deeper than our own personal worlds. Though Lent involves retreat and introspection, it is not for the sake of focusing on the self. Instead, it is about gaining inner-awareness, recognizing how the self is something that belongs to God and is blessed when aligned with God's love and call on our lives. That realization, when we experience it, is freeing—freeing from a need to possess. And it is cause for joy—in spite of the darkness of our world.

Someone recently commented about how many persons' *time, talent, and treasure* are involved in worship services, especially the “extra” ones—Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, etc. It wasn't quite “How many Worship Committee members does it take to screw in a light bulb?”, but it did give me the opportunity to focus on the extraordinary gifts that have been given for Lent 2018 at Second Presbyterian—and we've just BEGUN.

Have you seen the *exterior banners* made possible by Abel McBride? Ash Wednesday's was unique, and by the First Sunday of Lent we had another banner proclaiming **40 DAYS**—and there are two more banners to come!

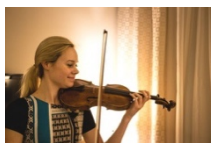


Ash Wednesday included four ensemble musicians, choir members from both First Presbyterian and Second Presbyterian, and our children's choir to accompany eight congregational chants. Each of these groups rehearsed separately and then rehearsed together before leading Ash Wednesday worship. Second mile giving?

For “special services” (those that include “extras”, such as imposition of ashes, healing oil and serving stations for healing or communion, and fire pits—IN THE RAIN, David Lopez) elders and deacons are often requested to do special activities that are beyond experience or comfort levels. They make themselves available and often become part of a remarkable thing (just ask them).

The *adult choir* has been asked to chant as the congregation gathers. That's extra rehearsal! —and anyone cantoring the “call to worship” will have given extra time beyond the gathering chant and the anthem of the day.

Bev has decided to *enhance the Lenten bulletins* with graphics—and the first one was the same design as the **40 DAYS** banner Abel had made possible for us. I love the graphics! but it takes time to find them and time to “make them work”. And then there are those EXTRA bulletins, filled with musical responses!



Every Sunday of Lent will include one of our musicians offering *Lenten offertory*: Bev Chavez, on organ; Jonathan Leavitt on French horn; Hillary Higgins (co-opted) on violin; Ryan Chavez on cello; and our new youth ensemble, Joyful Noise. Many hours of preparation are reflected in those 3-minute gifts.

Our children will sing during the serving of communion on March 4; they are working on “O Christ, Lamb of God” (with wind chimes). This will be followed by preparations for both Palm Sunday and Easter at the end of the month. All of this is labor intensive for parents, as well as singers and choral leaders.

I'm convinced that all (or most 😊) of the above are gifts of love and devotion, and the worship planners thank you for your “*time, talent, and treasure*”. It is worth noting that several persons giving the gifts listed above have expressed appreciation that they/we are in a community which gives opportunities for this level of involvement.



In addition, I/we wish to thank those of you who have expressed YOUR appreciation for the contribution these gifts are giving to you this Lent 2018. YOU are what our planning and preparations are all about.

May we all be blessed by these gifts for the Lenten journey.

Lent – 40 Days of Preparation



The Ash Wednesday service, in collaboration with First Church, was a beautiful and meaningful worship experience with instrumental music, combined First and Second Churches' choirs, and Pastor Rob cantoring with Taize responses. Communion was celebrated by intinction. Mickey McHugh joined Pastors Rob, Matthew Miller and Stephanie Kremmel to impose ashes. In the welcome rain, David Lopez managed the fire pit into which the congregants consigned written supplications. A new outdoor banner for Ash Wednesday has been provided by Abel McBride.

The first Sunday of Lent, on February 11 was marked by another new banner from Abel McBride. We included a healing ritual as part of the worship service which has become a meaningful experience for many. Susie Chang and Kelly Van Anandel assisted Rob in anointing the youth during the Children's moment. Yvonne Gallegos, Iris Sandoval, and Anita Romero Torres joined Rob for anointing others in the congregation. This was followed by the ordination and installation of newly elected elders and deacons.



March 4th will be Gifts of Women Sunday with worship conducted by the women of the church. Communion will be celebrated and there will be recognition of Mary Montoya, retiring after 15 years as paying treasurer. A reception will follow the service to honor her gifts to Second.

On March 10th Reverend Quiñones will return to us for the celebration of this 90th birthday. A luncheon reception will be served beginning at 2:00pm. More details to follow.

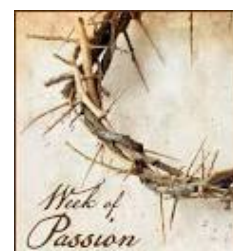
Holy Week



Palm Sunday, March 25th, will usher in Holy Week. Once again, Marie Kenny will be directing a Palm Sunday drama, and preparations are already under way. Susie Chang is ordering the Eco Palms and as in past years the palms will be provided by Yvonne Gallegos in memory of her husband Marty.

Maundy Thursday will be observed with a Passover meal in the Fellowship Hall beginning at 6:00pm. Foot and hand washing as well as communion will be part of the ritual. Soup donors are needed and a sign-up sheet will be posted soon.

Good Friday Service will begin at 7:00pm on March 30th. The service will include combined choirs of Second and The Church of the Risen Savior, the procession of the cross by Bob and Trancito Romero, and Tenebrae, a gradual darkening of the church following a series of readings. Finally, the church will be stripped, as we await the Easter morning resurrection.



On Easter morning there will be a sunrise service at 7:00am in the Quiñones Peace Garden. This will be followed by a potluck brunch before the 10:30am service. Congregants will be met at the entrance to the church by a Mariachi band and a cross into which people can insert flowers. The Johnson family will oversee the placing of flowers in the cross and process it into the sanctuary with the band at the beginning of the service. Lilies have been ordered and a sign-up sheet will be in the March newsletter and weekly bulletins.

NEW MEMBER – BARBARA ANDERSON

We are very happy to announce that Barbara Anderson has transferred her letter of membership from First Presbyterian Church in Sun City, Arizona, to Second. Welcome Barbara! You will see Barbara attend with her daughter Kathryn. We will introduce her, in worship, at our first opportunity.

Don Benedicto Sandoval

The fifth person to occupy our pulpit was the Evangelist Benedicto Sandoval.

He was one of four sons of Don Manuel Sandoval and Concepcion Romero of Chacon, New Mexico. Chacon is a settlement at the upper end of Mora Valley, 7 miles North of Holman. Chacon was named for members of the Chacon family. They were Albino, Damaseo, and Pedro Chacon. It was Don Manuel who donated the land on which to build the El Rito Presbyterian Church in Chacon, New Mexico. Don Benedicto also became its Elder.

Don Benedicto was born in Chacon, New Mexico in 1884 and received his early education in the Mission Schools at Mora, Las Vegas and Menaul School. While a student at Menaul, he and his schoolmates hauled the stone from the Sandia Mountains for the foundation of the then new three story building, Pierson Hall. This building also had a full basement.

Don Benedicto received his Theology training from Rev. Gilchrist and Dr. Thompson when the Del Norte College was moved from Colorado to Menaul School. He then took courses at the Las Vegas Normal, which is now Highlands University.

He was hired as a Presbyterian Evangelist, following in the footsteps of his father who had earlier become an Evangelist for the Presbyterian Church.

His first Church was at Las Vegas, New Mexico in 1905. He married in 1906 to an Allison-James graduate, Petrita Duran. He then took over the pulpit at the Church in Mora in 1910, before moving to Albuquerque in 1911. While in Albuquerque, he took over the Church in Los Martinez, which had become vacant when Rev. Quintana left. He moved into the house in which our church was organized. The house was next door to the Church building. He lived in this house until his death in 1973 at the age of 89. That house was razed in 1992, to make room for the play area for Martinez House of Neighborly Service. This made that home well over 100 years old. While here in Albuquerque, he helped raise money for the building of the Presbyterian Tuberculosis Sanitarium. His tenure here was only for one year when an ordained pastor was called to serve the Church in Los Martinez.

In 1925, he helped organize the Spanish Congregational Church in Albuquerque. He became its first Pastor. He was the pastor there until the death of his wife, Petra in 1929. Don Benedicto resigned to live in residence in Los Martinez. He helped with the printing of the Presbytery Newspaper, La Aurora. He was acting as printer and for a long time he was also the editor.

He became very interested in Law and bought several law books which he studied very diligently. He knew quite a bit of law and was able to advise his neighbors on legal matters. He was also appointed as a Notary Public and wrote and witnessed many legal documents. For a period of time, he also worked with the legendary Lawyer and Lawman, Elfego Baca.

Benedicto and his wife, Petra, had ten children. Mabel, Matilda, Rebecca, Alice, Lily and Niny were the daughters. Ben Jr., Manuel and Jacob were the boys. The tenth child was Ruth who succumbed in early infancy. The entire family became members of our church and were active as Sunday School teachers and church officers. They were also active in church groups and the choir. Manuel became an ordained Presbyterian minister. All the girls attended the Harwood School, located here in Albuquerque.

During World War II, the girls, with the exception of Matilda, moved to California to work there. Of the girls, only Rebecca returned to live in Albuquerque. Matilda became the longest remaining member of our Church until her death. The family became the backbone of our Church and remained so until the death of Matilda. There are no immediate family members of Don Benedicto Sandoval's family left in our Church. There is a grandson of Don Benedicto Sandoval, who is still a member of our Church. That grandson is Alfredo "Marty" Martinez.

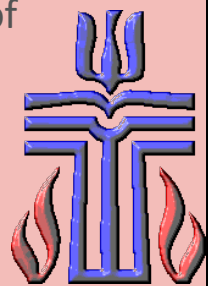
