

"Building Ministry"

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

There was a time when our church building was rarely used by people outside the church. Sharing space can always feel uncomfortable. What if the guests do damage? Who is going to open and lock? Who is going to stay on the premises to make sure nothing goes awry? What about liability issues? When we start asking those questions, and when we get stuck in those questions, the easiest way to resolve any concern is to not share the space. It is the path of least resistance.

And yet, the Bible is replete with themes of hospitality, community, and the importance of not only being courteous to your neighbor, but "loving your neighbor as yourself." Every church has to ask, "how are we being good stewards of the building given to us by God?" It has been pleasant to witness how our practices of sharing the building have expanded. Our fellowship hall is now used twice a month by Wings Ministry, and is used periodically by several other groups including Presbyterian Healthcare Services, and the Martineztown Workgroup. We also allow members and friends of the church to use that space for wedding fiestas, graduation parties, showers, and other receptions. Our parking lot is used Monday through Saturday by New Heart Center for Wellness, Taqueria Mexico, and once a month by the Martineztown Mobile Food Pantry. Our sanctuary has been used recently for a Puerto Rico fundraiser concert, is booked for a piano recital, and is used by other organizations for presentations. And we rent the Candelaria Wing to Family Promise for below-market value in an effort to support their vital mission.

I recently ran across an article in the "Christian Century" magazine called, "Five Dos and Don'ts about Using Your Church Building." It proposed important thoughts about how to use the sacred space that God provides to many church communities. The article suggests that, "A physical space can be at the vital center of ministry—if you don't make it an idol." The implication is that how the building is used, ought to be an important part of your ministry. Buildings are often underused or misused.

I am thankful that our space is being used by neighbors and friends, but I am also thankful that our church is frequently using it too! We converted a former office into a choir room. Several folks have renovated the basement as a lovely storage space. Work is being done to the kitchen and dreams are in the works for improving the Sunday School space next door and possibly even adding a nursery.

God's love and Spirit can never be confined by physical space. But when we make good use of the physical space we have; the result is more space made in our hearts and the hearts of others.

PUERTO RICO RELIEF EFFORTS

As Hurricane Maria hit Puerto Rico, a Puerto Rico Relief Committee was formed at Second. We began working towards relief for the people of Puerto Rico by accepting donations and planning a Concert and a Salsa Extravaganza. Through these efforts, we were able to raise over \$20,000 that was sent to the Presbytery of San Juan



to help in their recovery efforts. The Presbytery of San Juan used these funds along with funds from PCUSA Disaster Funds to distribute food, water, solar lamps, and generators. Aid sent from churches in the mainland was also used to establish a grant system where churches and communities could apply for aid and small grants. These grants were mainly used to: (1) purchase generators, (2) purchase clothes, mattresses, and other immediate needs for families that lost everything during the hurricane; and (3) to aid churches in establishing community kitchens. An estimated 6,000 people have been served with the funds raised from the concerts and contributions received at Second for the relief effort.

In addition, through the Puerto Rico Relief Committee at Second, I was able to insure a \$20,000 (in-kind) donation from Mosquito Curtains, Inc. in Atlanta. These donated materials have been used throughout the island for mosquito nettings in houses that don't have electricity for fans and air conditioning, nor do they have screens in their windows. Through these efforts, people are learning how to make mosquito nets of different sizes and are organizing the distribution process in their community. In association with Mr. Andrew Robertson, Vice President of Souder Miller & Associates Scientists and Engineers in Albuquerque and others, I helped make arrangements for granulated chlorine, donated by the American Chemical Society, to be sent to Puerto Rico. The chlorine is helping to purify water in the communities, where the drinking water has been too contaminated to drink.

I made a trip to Puerto Rico in February 2018, and visited communities such as Santa Rita, Barrio Obrero, San Rafael in Yabucoa, Emajagua in Maunabo, Patillas and Las Mareas. I was able to help as a volunteer in the ongoing recovery efforts. Churches in Puerto Rico have continued to serve their communities and play a very important role in the everyday lives of many families.

Although I have been discouraged at times, seeing how governmental agencies still have not reached many areas of the island, I was also touched and humbled by the spirit of cooperation, brotherhood, unity, and unstoppable faith these communities show regardless of their daily adversity. I was proud of the work many churches are doing, and I felt the presence of God among the people I visited. There is still much work to be done, but I am grateful to God that we were able to contribute our grain of sand to this vast ocean of need. I ask that you continue praying for the people of Puerto Rico and continue to help with donations and reaching out to our government to continue to aid Puerto Rico.



Recalling the Celebration of Holy Week

<u>Palm Sunday Service</u> featured a drama depicting Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem and the ensuing days leading up to his trial and crucifixion. The drama was skillfully directed by Marie Kenny. We are grateful to Marie and all of those who participated in the drama. We also acknowledge the gift of Eco Palms given by Yvonne Gallegos.

<u>Maundy Thursday</u> was observed with a candle lit Passover dinner of soup and flat bread in the fellowship hall. Rev. Kay and Pastor Rob lead the service. Communion was served at each table by Elders and Deacons followed by hand or foot washing. The Deacons were central to the preparation for this event and are held in appreciation.

<u>Good Friday</u> stayed with a powerful tradition when the choir from Church of the Risen Savior joined our choir in the presentation of *Passion of our Lord, according to St. John*. This was a Tenebrae service with extinguishing of the lights using the recently rediscovered candle holder from the basement, the stripping of the church, and the symbolic closing of the tomb.

<u>Easter Sunday</u> observances began by greeting the sunrise in the Quiñones Peace garden, decorated with dozens of butterflies. Pastor Rob led a service of the resurrection of our Lord and communion. Hymns were accompanied by George Huggins on guitar. This was followed by a hearty potluck breakfast.

Arrivals for the regular 10:30 Worship Service were greeted outdoors by a spirited Mariachi band. Kris and Becky Johnson and sons helped folks place flowers in the cross which led a procession into the church decorated with Easter lilies and other flowers. The band and choir contributed to a high energy celebration appropriate to the astounding message of an Easter morning.

Liturgical Colors for the month of May May is another month in which we use three different liturgical colors to enhance our worship service. May 6th and 13th are the 6th and 7th Sundays of Easter and the liturgical color is white, used for special days, season or seasons in the Redemptive work of our Lord. (The 13th is also Mothers' Day.). May 20th is Day of Pentecost and the liturgical color is red. Everyone is invited to wear **RED** and to bring a **RED** candle to the worship service to commemorate the fire and wind of the Holy Spirit. May 27th is Trinity Sunday and we once again will use white as our liturgical color. On Monday, May 28th we switch to green, the color of Ordinary Time. Except for Communion Sundays, when we return to white, we will see green in the sanctuary until the Advent Season when we will see the color purple.

<u>Worship and Music Committee</u> After years of support for the Worship Committee, Susie Chang and Dora Martinez have retired from the committee to pursue other interests. Their ideas, energy and historic context will be missed and we offer heartfelt gratitude for their past and current services in support of worship at Second Church.

These retirements and the recent whirl of Holy Week activities underline the need for new members on the committee. This committee has extraordinary leadership from Pastor Rob and Karmen Van Dyke, but other perspectives and ideas are valuable in providing context and relevance for our worship experience.
