RECALLING THE EASTER SEASON AND PENTECOST

Liturgical Colors: White is the liturgical color for the season of Easter and Trinity Sunday. Red is the color for Pentecost to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. We are grateful to have the banners produced by Thelma Trujillo for these special Sundays of the church year. Now, the Liturgical color seen in the sanctuary is green, the color of Ordinary Time. We will see green in the sanctuary until late November when white will celebrate Christ the King Sunday followed by the Advent Season when we will change to the color purple.

Pentecost and Fire of the Holy Spirit: Nearly 50 flames illuminated the communion table on Pentecost Sunday, thanks to the folks who shared red candles as symbols of the Holy Spirit. Of special note is the pair of floor candle holders. These beautiful brass candleholders were the gift of David and Lynn Gatewood. David's parents brought them home from one of their many international military assignments. Their country of origin is not known, but they appear to be from Southeast Asia. Our worship service is enhanced by these treasures from time to time.

SUMMER WORSHIP

The absence of our sabbatical bound clergy, has made planning an interesting and creative exercise. Three months of "enriching" worship in ways that we might not typically embrace has been possible through the energy of Rev. Kay Huggins and the "gameness" of the choir and congregational leadership. Here are some of the things you can expect (look forward to).

Preaching to the topic of "Rest": As our pastor considers resting (and traveling and studying) for three months, Rev. Kay is planning three looks at the significance "rest" can be for us: June "Rest as Relaxation"; July "Rest as Refreshment"; August "Rest as Renewal/ Reengagement".

The Lord's Table: Our experience with the Lord's Table will have some opportunities for enrichment, with the inclusion of laity as co-celebrants, and, possibly, a more active role in the liturgy for members of the congregation.

Guest Pulpit Supply: Planning for the summer includes a wonderful variety of fresh voices. Rev. Kay will preach the first Sunday (communion Sunday) of each month. The other weeks of pulpit supply will include:

Nelson Capitan, is a Native American elder from Laguna, who recently served as moderator of the Presbytery. The Laguna Congregation is experimenting with new forms of worship leadership. Currently, a team of pastors from the Presbytery preach and provide communion two Sundays each month; Laguna elders are conducting the service on the other Sundays of each month. In order to prepare themselves for such worship leadership, the leaders are participating in Theo Academy, an on-going training for Native American elders led by the Rev. Judith Wellington, designed to integrate traditional ways, Christian theology and worship leadership skills.

John Sitler, faculty and Religious Studies Department Chair at Menaul School, has served with the Peace Corps, worked with water resources in Mali, and served as a hospital chaplain. (He also is a singer with Quintessence in Albuquerque.) John has preached for us in the past—and coordinated Menaul graduations in years when Second Presbyterian hosted.

Joe Mares, is retired clergy and a recent resident of Albuquerque. Joe has served multiracial congregations in California and Colorado, most recently First Presbyterian of Aurora. He is now a member of the Presbytery of Santa Fe and is currently serving as Parish Associate for Camino de Vida, in Albuquerque's south Valley.

Susan Quass, Executive Director of New Mexico Conference of Churches, is Presbyterian clergy who has focused her ministry as an advocate for the poor and disenfranchised. In the U.S., Thailand, and Republic of Palau she has participated in social service and environmental justice work through both United Methodist and Presbyterian agencies. Susan's current position successfully employs her many years of working with diverse traditions and denominations.

Ann Edenfield Sweet is founder of Wings for L.I.F.E. Ministry, the local chapter of which is housed by Second Presbyterian on Mondays twice each month. Ann has a rich background of Christian education and experience, culminating with the work she does with prison ministries and the families of prisoners and returning citizens.

Takako Terino, chaplain at Menaul School since January 2017, was born in Japan, but educated in U.S. high schools and colleges. She is ordained clergy, trained in clinical pastoral care. Takako also serves as Chaplain for the clergy members of the Presbytery of Santa Fe.

Frank Yates, is retired pastor of St. Andrew, Albuquerque, and parish associate at First Presbyterian. He has taught theology, ethics, philosophy, world religions and Biblical studies at several institutions of higher education, including CNM, UNM, and St. Norbert's Master of Theological Studies program in Albuquerque. Some will remember Frank for both preaching and teaching at Second in the past year.

Voices from the Pew: Once a month we will be gifted with messages from members of our congregation. We will also be hearing *Voices from the Pew*. On June 24 we will hear life stories from Lorraine Romero and Conrad Rocha; on July 29, from Michael Rubio and Tessie Lopez; and on August 26, from Anita Romero Torres and James Brown. We are grateful that these friends are willing to share their stories with us. The Voices from the Pew Sundays will also have the flavor of a hymn sing, with some pre-selected and some congregation requested hymns! Begin to think now about a hymn you will request.

Children and Youth: Our children's moment will center around THE BOX! Each week The Box will go home with a family, who will select an object to "surprise" Rev. Kay—who must create a "children's moment" on whatever object immerses from The Box.

Youth will be featured in several leadership roles. We are planning for Annika Reid and Julian Griego to provide choral leadership, and several of our youth and children will prepare instrumental offertories.

Oldies, but Goodies: Once each month an anthem arranged and translated into Spanish by George Simmonds will be presented by ensembles from the choir. George was the principal contributor to the music of Second in its early history. As a missionary in Ecuador he became a prolific translator of traditional hymnody (800 hymns) into Spanish for several South American countries, before he became part of Second. Rev. Simmonds and his daughter, Betty Donaldson, who directed the choir at Second in the 50's, 60's, and 70's, are beloved historical figures for our congregation—and these anthems are selected as some of the favorites sung 40+ years ago—and many times since.

Guest Musicians: The summer will give many in our congregation the opportunity to provide special music. At this point, the calendar has their special talents offered nearly every Sunday of the summer. Let us know if you or yours should be on that calendar.

HELP WANTED

Flowers for Worship Service: In 2017, not a single Sunday was without flowers in the sanctuary. Thanks to all who made these beautiful additions to our services possible. A sign-up sheet is posted in the Fellowship Hall for the summer months. You may choose a date to honor or memorialize a special person or event which will be acknowledged in the bulletin. (If your date is already taken, please choose another date.)

Ushers/Greeters: You are invited to provide a welcoming greeting to visitor and members on Sunday mornings. We gratefully acknowledge that Louella Gurule' has been making calls for years to schedule Sunday greeters. In an attempt to make her job easier and to encourage wider participation, a sign-up sheet is posted in the fellowship hall. At least two people are required each Sunday and the first Sunday of the month will feature youth greeters. Please be in the sanctuary 30 minutes before the service begins and read the instructions at the back of the church. Light the candles at the beginning of the service. 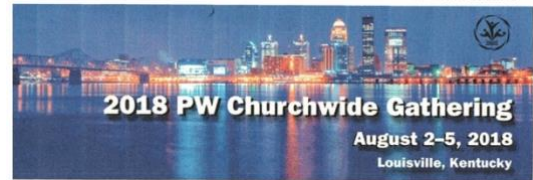

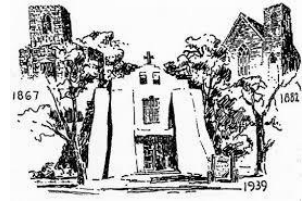
MENAU HISTORICAL LIBRARY OF THE SOUTHWEST

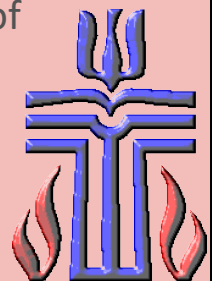
