Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

The three sabbatical months have nearly come and gone. As I sit in a coffee shop in southeast Albuquerque with a week left, I excitedly anticipate returning to Second Pres. It will be great to see you again, learn about your summer, and tell you about mine! I can tell you now that for the stated sabbatical objectives of relaxation, refreshment, and renewal, (the three R's of sabbatical), mission accomplished! For the first time in a long time, I am caught up on rest. I have also allowed myself to take time to engage the world in ways I normally don't. And, I traveled and took time to pay more attention to myself and the world around me. My spirit is renewed! For three months, the world slowed down, and that afforded me spiritual restoration which is a gift of grace. The result, God willing, will be the enhancement or our faith work together. In the same way that I have gained new insights, I trust that you have too. I eagerly await hearing about your worship and life experiences this summer.

You may recall a quote I indicated that would guide my time away. It is from Abraham Herschel, author of *Sabbath*. I will share sabbatical insights through preaching, and at the Wednesday morning, 11am Bible Study on September 5th. And I will return ready to hear from you!


A GIFT OF COLOR


you as we walk. Again, this year the age range is from early 20's to mid 70's; there are

WORSHIP AND MUSIC

Services during Pastor's Leave: While Pastor Rob was on sabbatical this summer, we enjoyed an extraordinary schedule of guests in our pulpit who offered a wide array of gifts. Chief among these voices was not really a guest but our own Parish Associate, the Reverend Kay Huggins. She led worship on the first Sunday of each month as we celebrated communion. But perhaps even more importantly, she led in the development of the liturgy to provide scriptural context and support for the range of guest speakers, empowering the messages they brought to us. For this leadership we are grateful. We also acknowledge the wealth of summer music directed by Karmen Van Dyke, and the innumerable tasks undertaken by Beverly Chavez to assure a successful summer program at Second Presbyterian Church.

The last Sunday of each month we celebrated worship with a hymn-sing of old favorites and included some Spanish language anthems. We heard thoughtful Voices from the Pew from Lorraine Romero, Conrad Rocha, Michael Rubio, Tessie Lopez, Anita Romero Torres and James Brown. We are grateful that these friends are willing to share their stories with us. Many folks were especially inspired by these life stories, and have requested that Voices from the Pew be continued in some form.

Special Services in the near Future:

September 2nd Pastor Rob and his family will return to our worship service after the summer sabbatical. During this service he will be "re-stoled." He will be preaching and giving the Children's Moment. Holy Communion will be co-celebrated with Reverend Kay with special bread. Flowers will be provided by Worship Committee in appreciation for all who have made the time of renewal a success. In collaboration with the **Personnel Committee**, the staff will be recognized for going beyond

expectations in planning and support for this successful time of renewal. A potluck lunch will be held during fellowship hour, so please plan to stay after worship for this time of joyful reunion.

- September 24th is designated as Gifts of New Immigrants Sunday. And;
- October 1st is World Communion Sunday. Plans for these services are not yet completed. Please watch the weekly bulletins for details as they emerge.

Liturgical Colors: The Liturgical color seen in the sanctuary is green, the color of Ordinary Time. We will see green in the sanctuary until late November, when Christ the King Sunday will be celebrated with white banners. The following Sunday begins the Advent Season when we will change to purple, the color of preparation. Look for some seasonal amendments over the next few months.

Ushers/Greeters: You are invited to provide a welcoming greeting to visitors and members on Sunday mornings. We gratefully acknowledge that Louella Gurulé has been making calls for years to schedule Sunday greeters. In an attempt to make her job easier and to encourage wider participation, a sign-up sheet is posted in the Fellowship Hall. If you have questions about participation in worship, contact Louella Gurulé lou3ag@gmail.com

At least two people are required each Sunday, and the first Sunday of the month will feature youth greeters. Please be in the sanctuary 30 minutes before the service begins and read instruction at the back of the church. Light the candles at the beginning of the service when Beverly plays the chimes. At the end of the service take the flame from the candles to the back of the church, symbolizing the Light going into the world.

Flowers for Worship Service: In 2017, and to this date in 2018, not a single Sunday was without flowers in the sanctuary. Thanks to all who made these beautiful additions to our services possible. To continue this notable support for our worship services, a sign-up sheet is posted in the Fellowship Hall. You may choose a date to honor or memorialize a special person or event, which will be acknowledged in the bulletin. (If your date is already taken, please choose another date.)

Worship and Music Committee meeting is scheduled for 9:00 AM on Wednesday, September 12. We will be orienting our new Young Adult Volunteer (YAV), Lauren LaMonica about the committee's work. For anyone interested in learning more about the Worship and Music Committee, you would be welcome to attend this orientation session.

<u>CHANGING SHAPE</u> CHILDREN'S CHOIR PROGRAM

The shape of the music program for our children and youth will be changing this fall, based on the ages of the current children and youth—and the interest indicated by those families wishing to participate.

CALENDAR: The original design of the children and youth music program was requested to be 4 to 6 weeks' blocks, followed by a break. This year our younger choir will have two significant breaks: the first will be all of October (after singing for World Communion) and the second is November 18 and 25 and December 2. Our older group will have three short breaks: October 7 (after they sing for World Communion) and 14, and one Sunday in November after they participate on November 4.

WHEN AND WHERE: We will begin the fall on September 23, with 11:45 to 12:45 rehearsals. This means that children and youth participating in music will move directly from Sunday School into the large room of the Candelaria Wing. Snacks will be available.

AGE GROUPS: The younger choir, Los Seminalles (The Seedlings), this fall will be open to 3 years old through First grade. The older group, Los Rotoños (The Sprouts) will be Second through Fifth graders.

PROGRAM: Both choirs will spend 5-10 minutes learning about music symbols and notes. The younger choir will primarily work with singing; the older group will sing and, beginning this year, play hand chimes, "barred instruments" (little marimbas), and drums.

LEADERSHIP: Debi Eisenhour will be lead teacher; Karmen Van Dyke will spend time with instruments and percussion; and Anita Abeyta and Becky Johnson will be support staff.

JOYFUL NOISE ENSEMBLE

The Joyful Noise Ensemble (the youth instrumental group which last year consisted of Layla Cocio, Gavin Hoover, Damian Johnson, Eli Lopez, Isaac Ploof) will this fall open its ranks to people of any age. We believe we have added an adult French horn player—and are looking forward to any other "wannabe" instrumentalists.

CALENDAR: Rehearsals begin on September 16 to prepare a Korean folk song for World Communion Sunday, October 7. The calendar after World Communion will be 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month, 11:45am-12:45pm (rehearsals 10/14 and 28, November 11 and 25, December 9 and 23). Sundays between rehearsals private help is available on request.

PROGRAM: The rehearsals will prepare music for worship, develop sight reading skills, and give opportunities to support the hymns. Solo opportunities are there ONLY for those interested (no harassment allowed).

LEADERSHIP: Joy Bohning will be conducting the ensemble, with Camila Hoover as support staff.

WHAT ABOUT GUITAR?

Bob Deuble will continue his Sunday 9:30am guitar class, beginning October 14. He will welcome anyone of any age, and guitars are available for those who have not played previously. Talk with Bob or Karmen Van Dyke for any additional information.

SUMMER THANK YOU'S

This has been an extraordinary summer of musical gifts and time generously given--especially by the Adult Choir and choral leadership. The choir faithfully led worship EVERY SUNDAY, other than Voices from the Pew Sundays, the first summer requesting this level of commitment in more than 22 years! Jonathon Leavitt's Native flute and Abel McBride JR's guitar were "first timers" for us, as was new drumming opportunities for Dolores Romero, Anika Reid, and Jonathon Leavitt. 
Thanks also to the CONGREGATION. You have demonstrated a great willingness to try new things with enthusiasm and joy that is contagious. One more time, many, many thanks.

WEDNESDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY


