
Mission Statement of Second Presbyterian Church

By now, you are likely aware of our congregation's selection as a host site for one of four Young Adult Volunteer or the Presbyterian Church (USA), placed in the Albuquerque area. Last month, we welcomed Lauren LaMonica to our church. We are blessed to have her with us until the end of July, 2019. Lauren is from Denton, Texas, where she grew up in a Presbyterian Church. She is excited to be in New Mexico and share her ministry gifts with our congregation. Lauren's future includes plans for seminary education, as she is considering the Youth Director training program at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Her year with us is an opportunity for her to learn more about leadership in the context of a church. Lauren will engage Second Presbyterian in a myriad of ways, including: attending session and committee meetings, and focusing her work with the children and youth, worship, mission, live wire and hospitality. Lauren also plans to help at the Menaul Historical Library and may even assist in coaching the Menaul Panther Girls Basketball Team.

Some have recently inquired what a Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) is. The YAV program is one of the blessings of the national church. The program places people between the age of 19 and 30 in year-long positions to "accompany local agencies (including churches) working to address root causes of poverty and reconciliation while exploring the meaning and motivation of their faith in intentional community with peers and mentors." YAVs serve during the academic year, August to July. There are twenty-two placement sites which includes US as well as international programs. (I served as a YAV in Guatemala from 2000-2001.) I invite you to welcome Lauren and take time to get to know her. The year will go fast. Just as we hope she is blessed by her experience, I know that our congregation will be blessed by Lauren as we journey together.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC By Don Bixby

World Communion Sunday October 7th. First adopted by the U.S. Presbyterian Church in 1936, World Communion is now observed by several Christian denominations. The celebration takes place on the first Sunday of every October to promote Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation.



World Communion Sunday offers us an opportunity to experience Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith. Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. On that day, we remember that we are part of the whole body of believers. Whether shared in a grand cathedral, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, in a meetinghouse, or in a storefront, Christians celebrate the communion liturgy in as many ways as there are congregations. World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about our wider community of faith.

This year the symbols of this wider community for us include a collection of chalices and an array of breads representing and breads representing a range of countries. Since most cultures around the globe do not have the luxury of our elegant communion serving pieces and disposable plastic cups, we are using handmade pottery vessels and gourds, an embroidered Turkish tablecloth, and handmade candle holders from Southeast Asia. *Everyone is also invited to dress in attire from other countries that you may have from travels or gifts.*

Food Donation On the first Sunday of the month you are invited to bring nonperishable foods that will be taken to the food bank.

Sign-up Sheets The programs and worship services of Second are maintained by the large and small gifts and acts of thoughtfulness by many people. These range from pulling weeds and cutting trees,



supplying fly swatters for the kitchen, cleaning and painting storage spaces, donating new round table covers, and a host of other kindnesses. For these gifts we are all grateful. You can support our programs in many ways, but there are signup sheets for three ways in the Fellowship Hall: 1) providing flowers, 2) serving as ushers, 3) helping with hospitality. You might want to choose dates with special significance.

All Saints Day November 4th. As in years past, you are invited to bring photos of loved ones who have passed during the year, as well as those remembered from previous years. These will be placed on tables at the front of the sanctuary and become part of our remembrance of the cloud of witnesses who have enriched our lives.
