A Four-Prophet Advent

Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

December 2 is the first of four Sundays in Advent—our sacred season of waiting and preparing for the coming of our Savior. This year, we will engage the season with an unfamiliar cast of characters. You may be most accustomed to John the Baptist's bold proclamations of one greater than him to come, and Mary's incisive song describing God's mercy extended to the most vulnerable. However, this year, our window into Advent will be more prophetic. This year's Old Testament readings feature a different prophet each of the four Sundays. You can read them in advance if you like:

December 2-Jeremiah 33: 14-16

December 9-Malachi 3: 1-4

December 16—Zephaniah 3: 14-20

December 23-Micah 5: 2-5a

As we consider prophetic utterances from long ago, let us remember that the words and wisdom from prophets are not always well-received by their contemporaries. We will also consider what prophetic voices say to us today. Each Sunday we will focus on one prophet, considering historical and contemporary understandings. Rumor also has it that during our worship services, we may be visited by the actual prophets as part of the children's sermons!

You are invited into this reflective season of Advent as we together await, with hope, the birth of the Lord our God.



ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Sunday Morning Adult <u>Present Word</u> meets at 9:00am each Sunday! There is a faithful core of eight, but room for double that number: so, if you are interested in studying scripture in an interactive approach inspired by Presbyterian curriculum, please join us! In December we begin a new quarterly: Our Love for God. Here is the description for the next three months.

This quarter's study begins with God's demands for our complete and undivided love as shown in passages from Deuteronomy and Psalms. It proceeds with our response to God's love in the advent of Christ, and the Epistles' interpretations of the nature and extent of our responses to God's love in Christ. It concludes with passages from three of the Psalms expressing glorification of God.



Unit I, "God Commands Our Love, Respect, and Obedience," has five sessions. The Deuteronomy passage contains a presentation of God's demand for total love and devotion. The session from Joshua contains his faithful statement of love and reverence for a liberating God. In Psalm 103, David expresses love and glorification of God for God's creative, sustaining, and protective actions. Luke portrays the advent of Christ and human response to God's act of fulfillment of God's promise. We are challenged in Matthew to love God through compassionate works.

Unit II, "Loving God by Trusting Christ," has five sessions. Matthew continues to inspire trust in God for all things, while James encourages total submission to God in love. In his letter to the Philippians, Paul gives an interpretation of human devotion to God in Christ; promotes selfless devotion through exemplification of Christ's total submission to God in love; and encourages giving up everything for the sake of one's love for Christ.

Unit III, "Love Songs That Glorify God," has three sessions. The quarter ends with Psalm 48, which focuses on a song of adoration for God's steadfast love; Psalm 66 focuses on part of a love song of praise to God for all God's mighty works of goodness; and Psalm 91 closes this unit with a praise song to God for assurance of protection and comfort for those who love God.



Wednesday Bible Study – 11 am

We are completing the first twelve chapters of the Gospel of John this December: **December 5, John Chapter 11**

December 12, John Chapter 12

Then, we will pause for a Christmas/New Year break and resume our studying on January 9 with a two-month session on Ecclesiastes. A brochure will be available before the end of the year.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC By Don Bixby

Candles as Symbols of Light during Advent candles are used in many ways to symbolize the light of Christ's birth in the darkening days of December. Each Sunday a family group will be lighting the candles in the Advent Wreath, celebrating *Hope*, *Peace*, Joy and Love. The Joy candle is pink while the other candles are purple, the liturgical color of Advent. On Christmas Eve we will be celebrating with a Candle Crèche, involving the lighting of Crèche figure candles followed by the lighting of hand-held candles. It is our tradition that the flame of these candles is passed from one person to another while the congregation sings "Silent Night." Finally, we gather outside around a fire to sing familiar carols to celebrate Christ's birth. Come join the Light.

Prophets Each week of this lectionary cycle the children (and the rest of the congregation, of course) will meet a prophet. Jeremiah, Malachi, Zephaniah, Micah, and Isaiah each were sent by God many years ago to help us understand that God's Son was coming to help us have a better relationship with our God. We are excited that Second will have the opportunity to meet them and hear their messages once again in 2018 A.D.

Food Donation On the first Sunday of the month you are invited to bring nonperishable foods that will be taken to the Albuquerque food bank to help feed the many in our community who are without adequate fool.

DOCTRINE OF DISCOVERY

Background:

The 222nd General Assembly (2016) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) called the church to confess its complicity and repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery. The action also called for a review of the history of the doctrine and the writing of a report on the doctrine.

The Doctrine of Discovery was first articulated in 1452 by Pope Nicholas V as the Papal Bull "Dum Diversas" and in 1496 by King Henry VII of England as a patent granted to John Cabot, which authorized and justified the destruction, killing, and appropriating of the lands of indigenous peoples and nations.

Recommendations Approved by the 223rd General Assembly (2018):

- 1. Urge the **session** of each congregation, as well as each mid council, COTE-member seminaries, Presbyterian Women's groups, and other organizations to confess their complicity and repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery.
- 2. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to create resources for education on racism that address the themes in this report involving Native American Presbyterians and congregations.
- 3. Encourage COTE-member seminaries to prepare students to articulate Native American theologies to give voice to these theologies and disrupt historic oppression and racism in Native American communities.
- 4. Encourage the commissioners of the 223rd General Assembly (2018) to review the 212th General Assembly (2000) report, "Comprehensive Strategy for Ministries with Native Americans" (Minutes, 2000, Part I, pp. 206ff), including its supplemental recommendations regarding all aspects of Native American ministry, and to lift up Native American ministries in the PC(USA).
- 5. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to create a speaker's bureau on Indigenous issues and publicize the list to the church.
- 6. Direct the Office of the General Assembly to amend the Standing Rules of the General Assembly so that each meeting of the assembly begins with an acknowledgement of whose land the assembly is meeting on and that greetings to the assembly include a welcome from those Indigenous peoples currently living on the land.
- 7. Direct the agencies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to begin each meeting with an acknowledgement of whose land they are meeting on and that greetings to the assembly include a welcome from those Indigenous peoples currently living on the land.

- 8. Encourage mid councils to begin their meetings with an acknowledgment of whose land they are meeting on and that greetings to the assembly include a welcome from those Indigenous peoples currently living on the land.
- 9. Encourage the Presbyterian Publishing Corporation to create resources that address the realities faced by Indigenous peoples in the United States and worldwide.
- 10. Encourage the Presbyterian Mission Agency to provide education on the human rights of Indigenous peoples as part of preparation for all mission co-workers.
- 11. Direct the Presbyterian Historical Society to identify and highlight resources related to Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and its relationships with Indigenous peoples.
- 12. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to initiate a survey in order to create a listing of courses taught in COTE-member seminaries that focus on the histories of Indigenous peoples and current issues facing Indigenous peoples, identifying specific instructors, courses, texts, and syllabi when possible.
- 13. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to identify in the Book of Confessions how our confessions may support the Doctrine of Discovery, how our confessions may challenge the Doctrine of Discovery, how our confessions provide evidence for ways the church can change, and to report its findings to the 224th General Assembly (2020).
- 14. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency to include the Doctrine of Discovery and the histories of Indigenous peoples and current issues facing Indigenous peoples in its antiracism and training efforts.
- 15. Encourage mid councils to request that when they contract outside antiracism trainers that the trainers address Indigenous issues and include Indigenous trainers, adjusting the content to be appropriate to the context in which the training takes place.
- 16. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency, in consultation with the Native American Consulting Committee (NACC), to devote an issue of Unbound to the Doctrine of Discovery, including histories of Indigenous peoples and issues facing Indigenous peoples.
- 17. Urge the **session** of each congregation—as well as each mid council, COTE-member seminaries, **Presbyterian Women's groups**, and national church agency—to **review the existing study** resources on the Doctrine of Discovery (posted on the Facing Racism website: https://facing-racism.pcusa.org/item/41901/), and to lift up histories of Indigenous peoples and current issues facing Indigenous peoples.
- 18. Direct the Presbyterian Ministries at the United Nations to monitor Indigenous issues in the United Nations and to share this information in its reporting.
