#### **July 2020**

Dear Second Church family,

You are invited to worship July 5th at Menaul School! It will be our first opportunity for in-person worship since March 8th—nearly four months. Know that significant planning is going into ensuring safety for the event. We will be blessed by music, prayer, scripture and sermon as we gather to honor and worship God. But know that we will not be able to hug and congregate as we normally do. We have to respect social distancing guidelines. Chairs will be set up that need to remain apart—the *only* exception is for parents with children. A time will come when we can return to social normalcy. But for now, to keep our congregation safe for in-person worship, utmost caution is critical.

If you are ill or do not feel comfortable coming, please stay home and wait for future worship opportunities. Remember that the state of New Mexico denotes people 65 or older as more vulnerable to COVID-19. As a precaution, ushers will take everyone's temperature with non-contact thermometers. If you are unable, or think it best not to join us this time, the service will either be live-streamed or recorded, and put on the website. Though it is the first Sunday of the month, we will not have communion. Below are important details for worship. If you have any questions, you can always call Pastor Rob (505-363-5368); Worship Chair, Allan Holmquist (505-401-2790); or Music Director, Karmen Van Dyke (505-301-0033).

When: July 5th, 9:00am. Please arrive between 8:30-8:45 am.

Where: Hart Park, Menaul School. Please park in southern parking lots of the Menaul Campus.

**Capacity:** Up to 100 people can be accommodated.

**Safety:** Masks are required! Extra masks will be available along with hand sanitizer. Chairs will be distanced and can *only* be moved together by parents with children for supervision.

Bulletin: There will be no bulletin. Song sheets will be waiting on the chairs.

**Ushers:** As you arrive, an usher will greet you at your car, and escort you to your seat. After the benediction, remain in your seats and an usher will escort you to your vehicle.

**Offering:** You will be encouraged to give online, send a check to the church, or a plate will be available for dropping off during arrival or departure.

From the CDC: "Consider holding services...in a large, well-ventilated areas or outdoors."

#### FOOD BANK, GARDEN, LITURGICAL COLORS

#### Food Bank Donations

When we are in normal times, we celebrate Holy Communion on the first Sunday of every month and collect non-perishable food items for the regional food bank. In the current epidemic, we are missing Holy Communion and our usual food collections. Yet the calls on the food bank system are increasing as more people are losing employment and finding their food resources limited. At the same time shopping challenges and shortages affect donations to the banks.

With a focus on the needs of seniors, Roadrunner Food Bank has provided nearly 8,000 food boxes to Senior sites. They continue to run drive-through mobile food pantries, and work with NM Aging and Long-Term Services Department.

If you are able to help, here is a short list of actions you can take to support the community needs for food assistance:

- 1. Make your own collection of food at home until the current epidemic is controlled.
- 2. Deliver food directly to drop boxes at:
  - Roadrunner Food Bank 5840 Office Blvd NE, Albuquerque, NM 87109; open M-F 9-4
  - The Storehouse, 106 Broadway Blvd SE, Albuquerque, NM 87102; open Wed-Sat 9-12
  - Other collections sites about which you are aware
- 3. Send a check directly to these food banks
- 4. Send a check to Second, designated for the food bank.
