Dear Second Church Family,

It has been an impactful month in the life of our church. We lost Jessie McCoy and Elifas Santillanes, two dear church members whose cumulative membership of the church is more than 111 years. We prayed for many, including Pastor Kay who on July 25 had successful lung surgery, and John Van Dyke who has made two recent trips to the E.R. Our live streaming committee met to plan future live streams of worship from our church in the fall. I met with Guillermo Yela to plan for our August 23rd Presbytery worship which will be bilingual and include Camino de Vida and churches up North. Even though we do not come together in-person right now on Sunday mornings, we are active and our sense of community is strong. A special thanks to the deacons, including Beverly Molo who sends out mail to those without computers every week, to Pastor Kay and so many others that reach out every week through teaching and calls. They, like many of us, are working hard to continue to pray together and experience that connection as best we can.

This will be my last Friday email for a couple of weeks. Monday, July 27, I will begin a week of study leave followed by a week of vacation. You will be in my prayers and I would ask that you might keep me in yours. If you wish for pastoral care sometime in the two weeks I am away, Rev. Matthew 25

"For I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me." Often times when we at Second discuss the blessing and implication of being good stewards, we tend to think of church finances and yearly

campaign pledges that we are invited to make to support not only the physical church, but most importantly, to support Christ's mission and ministry. And, Second is actively engaged in fulfilling Christ's mandate by becoming the 100th congregation to become a **Matthew 25 Congregation**, an initiative of the Presbyterian Church, USA, since the 222nd General Assembly in 2016, which invites Presbyterians to lift the vision in Matthew 25 by actively engaging in the world. Our bilingual and multicultural church is providing various outreach services, among which is providing transitional housing to transgender women seeking asylum in the U.S. Listed here are the ongoing mission priorities of the Presbyterian Mission Agency as they relate to Matthew 25:

- 1. responding with compassion and justice by dismantling racism which involves breaking laws, policies, practices and structures that reinforce and perpetuate discrimination, prejudice and oppression of people of color;
- 2. eradicate systemic poverty by better understanding the root causes of poverty and in a non-paternalistic way, advocate and support efforts through laws, policies, practices and systems that perpetuate poverty, and
- 3. building congregational vitality by working continuously and intentionally towards faith development that in turn leads disciples who are members of a church to engage with their community to make new disciples as a result of their witness and work.

In the midst of the COVID-19 Pandemic and our inability to physically congregate weekly to worship, share handshakes and abrazos, our technology permits us to gather virtually as a Presbytery, and again via the Fellowship Hour shared by Second, which has been a blessing to all who are able to participate.

1001 WORSHIPING CONGREGATIONS

In 2012, the 220th General Assembly declared a commitment to a churchwide movement to create 1,001 worshiping communities over the next 10 years. Note that the initiative does not say "develop churches". As I researched the progress of this initiative, I came across some interesting data to share with you:

- Many of the new worshiping communities are led by leaders of color, immigrants, or women.
- 53% are communities of color, new immigrant or intercultural.
- Korean American Presbyterians are the fastest growing membership group in the PC(USA).
- Next largest growing new immigrant group in the PC(USA) are Africans from many different African nations.
- Staff in Racial Equity & Women's Ministries speak ten (10) different languages.
- The first worshiping community of color in the PC(USA) was Native American.
- The largest mission organization in the church is Presbyterian Women.
- 64% of participants in new worshiping communities are under the age of 40.
