Shedding

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Every year on Ash Wednesday, we are beckoned to join in a Lenten pilgrimage. The season of Lent is a forty-day journey with Christ that begins in the wildness and leads to the cross of Calvary. It is a journey upon which we are invited to travel light. It is difficult to progress very far spiritually when we are encumbered with "too much stuff." Stuff can be material goods, but it can also be anything that takes our focus off of the divine. You are aware of the common practice of giving something up for Lent. Perhaps that tradition is informed by the idea that we cannot journey too far if we are carrying too much.

I am just getting into a book that Pastor Kay recommended called *Without Oars: Casting Off into a Life of Pilgrimage*, by Wesley Granberg-Michaelson. Though I am only a couple of chapters in, it is clear that the emphasis on pilgrimage is the recognition that to live life on a faith journey, is to always be in "search for the soul's true home," (Pg. 3). On the journey of life, we can travel as passive passengers or we can adventure as pilgrims.

Lent is an appropriate season to be a pilgrim. And as mentioned, to be a pilgrim, we have to let a lot of things go. Granberg-Michaelson calls it "shedding." You might say that seasonal shedding is not reserved only for cats and dogs. Shedding is, "a spiritual commitment to leave behind all of our preconceived ideas, arguments, agendas, and biases, holding them in suspense, while asking only one question: "Am I indifferent to everything besides God's will?" (Pg13). If you have attended our Ash Wednesday service, you recall the practice of writing down something we need to let go of, and burning it in a fire pit outside the church. That practice is a way we can act out our letting go.

For Lent, it may be easier to give up chocolate, alcohol, or fried food (and those indeed can be worthwhile goals). But this year, while in the middle of a pandemic, our minds might be more spiritually inclined. Especially since we have already lost some things that we had previously taken for granted. If you are to conceive of Lent, and life for that matter, as a pilgrimage: what is going on in your life that is absorbing you instead God's will? What is keeping you from fully loving God, neighbor, and self? An aimless pursuit? A prominent insecurity? Unresolved anger or fear? That is a question that maybe only you can answer. But when you do, you may have just identified what to leave behind so you can take the first steps with Jesus into Lent.

WEDNESDAY BIBLE STUDY IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH

You are invited to Zoom Bible Study: Wednesday in February and March: Wednesdays at 4pm or 8pm – register at kay.huggins@me.com



This spring we will conclude our study of parables during the four Wednesdays of February; then devote March to a review of the passion narratives of the four gospels. Since there are five Wednesdays in March, the final Wednesday, during holy week, will be an open (but directed!) conversation on the material studied thus far in the Zoom Bible Study: Joel, Beatitudes, Parables (Part 1 & 2), Biblical Prayers, and the Passion Narratives.

As we continue the study of the core themes of Jesus' message (that is a polite way of saying: why he was crucified) we find his teaching merging with his pattern of living...until as the end of his life becomes a parable signifying much more than we can even imagine.

- Feb. 3, **The Challenge of the Hour**: The Parable of the Debtor (Matt. 5:25), the Parable of the Unjust Steward (Luke 16:1-18) and the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16: 19-31)
- Feb. 10, **Realized Discipleship**: Twin Parables of the Treasure in the field and the Pearl (Matthew 13:44-45); the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), the Description (parable) of the Last Judgment (Matt. 25: 31-46)
- Feb. 17, Via Dolorosa and Consummation: The shift after Peter's Confession, Similes in Jesus' way: no shelter (Luke 9:58), the cup he must drink (Mark 10:38. 14:36), the stone rejected (Mark 8:31), the wheat must die (John12:25); and the Consummation, The Parable of the Tares among the Wheat (Matt. 13:24-30), and the Parable of the Fishing Net (Matt. 47-50)
- Feb. 24, **Jesus' Parabolic Actions:** the entry into Jerusalem and the cleansing of the Temple (Mark 11: 1-11, 15-19), and the Last Supper (Luke 22: 14-20 and John 13:1-20)

With the core teachings from the parable ringing in our hearts, we move into the Gospel passion narrative...moving in chronological order.

- March 3, The Passion according to Mark, read Mark 14:32-15:47
- March 10, The Passion according to Matthew, read Matthew 26:36-27:66
- March 17, The Passion according to Luke, read Luke 22:39-23:56
- March 24, The Passion according to John, read John 18:1-19:42
- March 31, The Core Teaching and the Passion reconsidered: an invitation to conversation.

FEBRUARY IN THE SEASONS OF THE CHURCH

Even though February is the shortest month of the year, there are several liturgical highlights in the Church Season this month. February opens with us still in Ordinary Time, which is designated by the color **green**. You might catch a glimpse of **green** paraments in the Presbytery Collaborative Worship Service taped at Second. In this season, the Communion Table is brightened by the handmade Rio Grande weaving recalling the Hispanic history and flavor of our fellowship. We are grateful to Ruth Montoya for the loan of this beautiful heirloom.

On February 14th, the liturgical color is white as we celebrate the *Transfiguration of the Lord*. Transfiguration Sunday celebrates the revelation of God in Jesus Christ and Christ's fulfillment of the law and the prophets. Jesus' radiant appearance on the mountaintop evokes the devouring fire of the glory of the LORD at Mount Sinai. God claims him as a beloved child, in whom God is well pleased. In some accounts of this event, an image of Christ is flanked by Moses, representing the law, and Elijah, representing the prophetic tradition, demonstrating the



relationship of the Word of God to the tradition of Israel as set forth in the Hebrew Scriptures. In Jesus' transfiguration, we are assured that Jesus is the hope of the ages, who fulfilled the Law given through Moses, the one dreamed of by the prophets, of whom Elijah is the greatest.

Just days later, on the 17th, we come to Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. The liturgical color is **purple** for repentance, with a public act of confession and contrition. In some traditions, Ash



Wednesday is a fast day, beginning the Lenten time of fasting and preparations that culminate in Easter. Acknowledging that all have fallen short of the glory of God, we stand in solidarity as fellow creatures before our Creator, acutely aware of our mortality. In many traditions, this is symbolized through the imposition of ashes — drawing a cross on one's forehead with the ashes. In past years we have used the ashes from the palm fronds of the previous Palm Sunday. The ashes symbolize the dust and broken debris of our lives. *Plans are still being made about how we at Second will observe Ash Wednesday as well as other aspects of the Lenten and Easter Season.*

Trusting Christ's resurrection, we listen for the Word of God in the time-honored stories of the church's Lenten journey. We follow Jesus into the wilderness, resist temptation, fast, and proceed "on the way" to Jerusalem and the cross. Our Lenten journey is one *metanoia* ("turning around"), of changing directions from self-serving toward the self-giving way of the cross.

Ecclesiastes 3:20 – "All go to the same place; all come from dust, and to dust all return."
